His Holy Spirit is at work in the world and at work in our lives. It is important for us to be mindful of that fact by praying for the Spirit to continually come into our lives and for us to be entirely open to the Spirit. This little hymn can give us a sense of that openness. Dear Lord, Melt my ego. Mold me after the pattern of Your Image and Likeness and help me to follow Your Son. Fill me with Your Spirit of Love. And use me to be an instrument of Your salvation! Amen.
