“Depart from me.”

Jesus uses an image, in his teaching, of a Master who has locked the gate and he tells those who are knocking, “I do not know where you are from. Depart from me.” As Christians, or just as seekers of truth, it's in our nature to come to a greater knowledge of God. One of the ways that we can do that is by building a prayer life. There is an excellent book by Fr. Michael Scanlon, T.O.R., called Appointment With God. It's a great resource for beginning to build a life of prayer. His theory is that in our culture we live by a calendar, or a schedule. And his answer to that is to make time for prayer by putting God on the calendar – on the schedule – to make an appointment. That's the first step and it's incredibly important. Making the time and showing up is paramount to a good prayer life. Everyone has a different personality and there are many methods that work for different people, but making the time is more than half of the struggle. Maybe we can all take a little time and reflect on our own prayer lives and consider whether or not we're still setting enough time aside for God. When we do that, we realize that God wants us for Himself and when we are open to that, we will find that God will lead us to wide open pastures.

Guys' Group

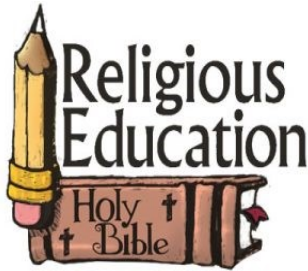
Join our Men's ministry for prayer, discussion, and fellowship in the Lounge. We meet every Thursday at 8:00pm.

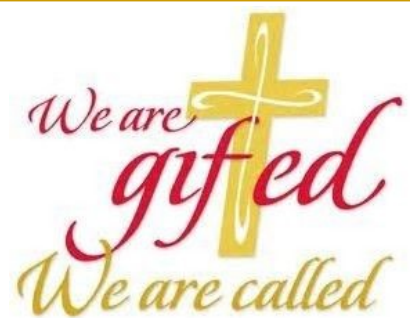
Time and Talent Sign Up Sundays
