The prayers of St. Paul

In St. Paul's Second Letter to the Thessalonians from our second reading today, St. Paul prays for them. He prays that God might encourage them and strengthen them. He asks that their hearts may be directed to the love of God and that they may be given the endurance in Christ. This is an incredible prayer intention that St. Paul has for the Thessalonians. Consider that as our goal -- that our whole lives, our entire day might be taken up with the pursuit of being directed to the love of God. Perhaps this is the prayer that we should have for one another, that our hearts might be strengthened and directed to the love of God and that we might endure our trials as Christ endured His trials. St. Paul is also humble and asks for the prayers of the community that he might continue to spread the faith to others. In this age of the New Evangelization these things should be our goals. We ought to consider the spread of the faith. But first, we must know what the love of God does for our own hearts. This is what faith does for us. May we come to be strengthened by it and take up our place in this process of handing on the faith, so that others might be directed to the love of God also.
