In 2020, we heard plenty of voices speaking out and sharing their opinions, but many of those words were not comforting or hope-filled. Sometimes, it was hard to know which expert or “instant expert” to listen to and it is still difficult to hope as we struggle to regain our balance as a nation and as a Church. The Word of God offers us peace this day. All our readings remind us of a faithful God who always keeps the promises made. Isaiah prophesied about the end of Jerusalem’s time away from God, and the Psalm speaks of “seeing God’s kindness and hearing what God proclaims.” Second Peter explains that God’s timing may not be the same as ours, but good things await those who are alert. In the Gospel, John the Baptist reiterates and completes the prophecy of Isaiah by laying the groundwork and preparing the way for those who await the coming of the Messiah.

THE BEGINNING

With COVID-19, much time is spent wondering “where did it start?” or “who passed it on to whom?” Though science can tell us much there are many unanswered questions. Today’s Gospel is about as concrete as sacred scripture gets. We know this is the beginning of the Gospel of Mark, which was the first Gospel to be written down in about 70 AD. Unlike Luke and John, Mark does not begin with an infancy narrative of Jesus. He starts by proclaiming the prophecy of Isaiah. This section was written six hundred years before Christ, in another time of great upheaval, as the Israelites were displaced from their homeland during the Babylonian Exile. The first words of Isaiah 40 are “Comfort, comfort, my people.” John the Baptist starts by explaining he is the go-between, sent to “Prepare the way.”

DON’T SHOOT THE MESSENGER

While proclaiming the coming Christ is a thing of joy, John’s words are also harsh, reminding us to repent and prepare. People were threatened by them two thousand years ago, and some still are today. People can hear them and be turned off by “fire and brimstone,” and none of us like to be told what to do. But think about it. This year, we have all engaged in social distancing and endured hardships to protect our families and others.

Similarly, when you have company coming, you do house cleaning, meal prep, and lots of things to make the place ready for the arrival of your guests—necessary preparation. So we as individuals must make ourselves ready for the coming Christ to reside in us. This may mean repenting for sins, seeking the sacrament of penance or taking time with a spiritual director. Perhaps it means carving out more times and places for Christ to be born in our hearts or taking on another spiritual practice. Maybe it means simply doing what the psalm asked and using our eyes and ears and mind and heart to seek Christ.

EL PRINCIPIO

Debido al COVID-19, se dedica demasiado tiempo a preguntarse “¿dónde comenzó?” o “¿quién se lo contagió a quién?” Aunque la ciencia tiene mucho que decirnos hay muchas preguntas que no se han respondido. El Evangelio de hoy es tan concreto como lo son las Escrituras. Sabemos que este es el principio del Evangelio de Marcos, del que se cree fue el primero que fue escrito por ahí del año 70 DC. A diferencia de Lucas y Mateo, Marcos no empieza con una narrativa de la infancia de Jesús. Él comienza proclamando la profecía de Isaías. Esa parte de Isaías fue escrita seiscientos años antes de Cristo, en otro tiempo de gran cambio, cuando los israelitas fueron desplazados del territorio que habitaban y llevados al exilio en Babilonia. Las primeras palabras en Isaías 40 son: “Consuelen, consuelen a mi pueblo”. Juan el Bautista comienza explicando que él es el intermediario, enviado a “preparar el camino”.

NO DISPARES AL MENSAJERO

Si bien proclamar la venida del Cristo es una cosa de alegría, las palabras de Juan también son duras, nos recuerdan que nos arrepintamos y nos preparemos. Hace dos mil años, para algunas personas esas palabras fueron una amenaza y también lo siguen siendo para otras hoy en día. Las personas pueden escucharlas y ser apagadas por “el fuego y el azufre”, y a ninguno de nosotros nos gusta que nos digan qué hacer. Pero piensen en ello. Este año, todos nos hemos involucrado en el distanciamiento social y hemos soportado dificultades para proteger a nuestras familias y a otros.

Del mismo modo, cuando tienes compañía, limpias tu casa, preparas una comida y haces muchas otras cosas para preparar tu casa para la llegada de tus invitados, la preparación es necesaria. Así que como individuos debemos prepararnos para la llegada de Cristo a vivir en nosotros. Esto puede significar arrepentirse de los pecados, acudir al Sacramento de la Reconciliación o dedicar un tiempo con un director espiritual. Tal vez signifique desear más momentos y lugares para que Cristo nazca en nuestros corazones o buscar otra devoción espiritual. Quizá significa sencillamente hacer lo que el salmo nos pide y usar nuestros ojos, oídos, mente y corazón para buscar a Cristo.

FACEBOOK GROUP- One of the things we look forward to most during Advent is connecting as a community. Things may be different this year, but we can all still connect, pray and deepen as disciples together in our private Advent Facebook Group! It's a safe, bilingual and virtual

gathering place where we can get together as a parish community for the four weeks of Advent. There will be opportunities to pray together, learn more about our faith and traditions as Catholics, ask questions, support each other and celebrate the good things happening in our lives. GIVE THE GIFT OF RECONCILIATION-

In order for us to continue to offer the Sacrament of Reconciliation on Saturday afternoons, we need several more volunteers to serve as "hosts" to provide direction to those coming for confessions. This involves about 2 hours of time, from 3pm-5pm on Saturday to help people sign up for their

time slot and direct them to the right room when it's their turn. This is a simple but important ministry, requiring at least one person per week or ideally, two people working together. Right now we have just one pair of volunteers and this is not sustainable. We need to have at least three more sets of volunteers (either an individual or a team of two) so that volunteers are serving once a month. If you're not already serving in a ministry, please consider giving about 2 hours of your time each month so that we can continue to offer the Sacrament of Reconciliation on Saturdays. Solicitamos Ayuda con las confesiones del

sábado. - Para que podamos continuar ofreciendo el Sacramento de la Reconciliación los sábados por la tarde, necesitamos varios voluntarios más para servir como "Anfitriones" para proporcionar orientación a los que vienen a confesarse. Esto implica aproximadamente 2 horas de tiempo, de 3 pm a 5 pm el sábado para ayudar a las personas a registrarse en el horario y dirigirlos al sitio correcto cuando sea el turno. Este es un ministerio simple pero importante, que requiere al menos una persona por semana o, idealmente, dos personas trabajando juntas. En este momento solo tenemos un par de voluntarios y esto no es sostenible. Necesitamos tener al menos tres grupos más de voluntarios (ya sea un individuo o un equipo de dos) para que los voluntarios estén sirviendo una vez al mes. Si aún no está sirviendo en un ministerio, considere dar aproximadamente 2 horas de su tiempo cada mes para que podamos continuar ofreciendo el Sacramento de la Reconciliación los sábados. Be a Christmas Angel! Bring a smile to one of the 155 children in need within our St. Raphael parish or one of the 57 teenagers in Wake County Foster Care that we are assisting this year. New winter clothing and shoes are the biggest need during this Christmas season. Yes, a winter hat, shoes, or a jacket may seem like a small thing to many, but these little things that meet a physical need or a toy that makes a wish come true make a huge difference to a low income family or, in the case of foster care, a child who is not living with a parent and counting on the kindness of a stranger. And this year, many of our parishioner's jobs and household incomes have been affected due to the pandemic.

Tags will be available before and after upcoming masses and through a Sign-Up Genius link on our parish website. Just wrap the requested gift, attach a tag identifying the child and item, and return it by placing under the Christmas tree in the atrium between 3 and 8 pm on Saturday, 8 am and 4 pm on Sunday, or 6 and 8 pm Tuesday night. Gifts are due by December 13. Our team will be there to assist you!

Don't feel comfortable shopping for a specific gift tag or want to help by purchasing those gifts that people forget to return? Our Elves are ready to assist you. Simply donate a gift card to a place like Walmart that has a large selection of items, a VISA gift card, or a monetary gift placed in an envelope marked "Angel Tree" and place in the Donation slot in the wall adjacent to the front entrance to the parish office and we'll take care of shopping on your behalf.

As long as many of you can remember, food and money for turkeys was also collected to assist our parish families with a nice meal for the holiday. For the safety of all, this year we are instead **collecting grocery gift cards in lieu of food items to provide a Christmas meal.** Gift cards to a lower priced grocer like Food Lion in denominations of \$20 - \$25 each will allow us to provide each SRCC Angel Tree family with food. Donate a grocery gift card in an envelope marked "Angel Tree" and place in the Donation slot in the wall adjacent to the front entrance to the parish office.

Any extra cards will be prioritized to larger families and those with the greatest need.
