Sixth Sunday of Easter

Reading I

Acts 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48

When Peter entered, Cornelius met him and, falling at his feet, paid him homage. Peter, however, raised him up, saying, "Get up. I myself am also a human being." Then Peter proceeded to speak and said, "In truth, I see that God shows no partiality. Rather, in every nation whoever fears him and acts uprightly is acceptable to him." While Peter was still speaking these things, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who were listening to the word. The circumcised believers who had accompanied Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit should have been poured out on the Gentiles also, for they could hear them speaking in tongues and glorifying God. Then Peter responded, "Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people, who have received the Holy Spirit even as we have?" He ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ.

SOLEMNITY OF THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD

Forty Days after the Resurrection of Jesus Christ, the *Acts of the Apostles* records Jesus' Ascension into heaven. The Ascension is an important Christian feast attesting and celebrating the reality of the God-Man Jesus Christ's returning to the Father, and promise to return again. The Ascension is the final component of the *paschal mystery*, which consists also of Jesus' Passion, Crucifixion, Death, Burial, Descent Among the Dead, and Resurrection. The Catholic Catechism summarizes three important theological aspects of the Ascension:

...Christ's Ascension marks the definitive entrance of Jesus' humanity into God's heavenly domain, whence he will come again (cf. Acts 1:11)

...Jesus Christ, the head of the Church, precedes us into the Father's glorious kingdom so that we, the members of his Body, may live in the hope of one day being with him for ever.

...Jesus Christ, having entered the sanctuary of heaven once and for all, intercedes constantly for us as the mediator who assures us of the permanent outpouring of the Holy Spirit (665-667).

With the participation of so many in the Reading Catholic Community in our Gospel Giving program, we were able to assist the following very grateful organizations:

Helping Our Troops – The inventory of donated goods that HOT ships to our troops serving abroad had been running low have now been replenished.

GOD'S LOVE FOR ALL HIS PEOPLE EVERYWHERE...

All of us who consider ourselves Christians are required to “love one another, because love is of God” (1 John 4:7). The first reading on this Sixth Sunday of Easter recounts the story of Peter’s meeting with the centurion Cornelius and his household. He is described as a devout, God-fearing, and generous man. Previous to this encounter, the early followers of Jesus had been converts from among the Jews. After this encounter with the Roman and a vision that Peter had, he understood that our Lord always meant for Gentiles to be welcomed in the Church. “Then Peter proceeded to speak and said, ‘In truth, I see that God shows no partiality. Rather, in every nation whoever fears Him and acts uprightly is acceptable to Him.... Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people, who have received the Holy Spirit even as we have?’” (Acts 10: 34-35, 47). While Peter was speaking with them, the Holy Spirit came upon the people in a way similar to that of Pentecost with Christ’s own disciples. Preaching among non-Jews by St. Paul and others was now recognized as being a vital part of God’s plan to introduce the message of Christ to the entire world. This chapter from the Acts of the Apostles was essential in reinforcing God’s love for all His people everywhere. The readings from St. John, both the letter and the Gospel, forcefully address the necessity of embracing God’s love for us and reciprocating it. Moreover, all of us who consider ourselves Christians are required to “love one another, because love is of God” (1 John 4:7). Love is the way of Christ, that is, the way of life for all who walk in His steps. If we want to welcome others to faith in Jesus and His Church we need to show them the love that He has put in our hearts. This is the same love that led Him to Golgotha and the sepulcher, and then to His Resurrection and Ascension.

Let us think about our relationship with Christ and how we can show the light of His face to the people we meet.

If we do that, we will encourage others to draw closer to the compassion and salvation of our Redeemer.

PRAYERFUL READING, OR *LECTIO DIVINA*

1. *Lectio*: Read a Scripture passage aloud slowly. Notice what phrase captures your attention and be attentive to its meaning. Silent pause.
2. *Meditatio*: Read the passage aloud slowly again, reflecting on the passage, allowing God to speak to you through it. Silent pause.
3. *Oratio*: Read it aloud slowly a third time, allowing it to be your prayer or response to God’s gift of insight to you. Silent pause.
4. *Contemplatio*: Read it aloud slowly a fourth time, now resting in God’s Word.

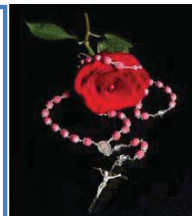

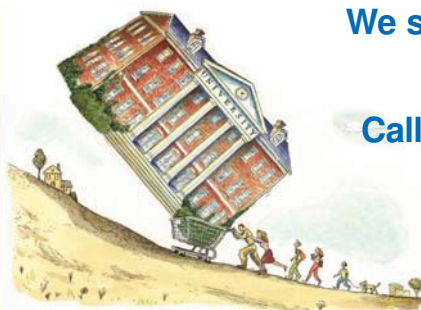
