FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

ABSTINENCE - ASH WEDNESDAY and GOOD FRIDAY are days of abstinence. FRIDAYS OF LENT are also days of abstinence. ABSTINENCE is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed.

FASTING - **ASH WEDNESDAY** and **GOOD FRIDAY ARE DAYS OF FASTING** - fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

Please talk to one of the priests when in doubt concerning fast and abstinence.

This Wednesday, we begin our Lenten Journey: a time of preparation for the celebration of Easter, extending to Holy Thursday. Lenten ashes come from the burnt and blessed palms from the previous year's Palm Sunday. Palms are a living plant, and a symbol of victory and triumph, but they are burned to dust and become a symbol of sorrow and repentance. The ashes we receive on Ash Wednesday remind us of our call to repent and believe in the Gospel. *The Church gives us*Lent as a time to change, to become a better version of ourselves, and to become more like Jesus. The practices of Lent – prayer, fasting and almsgiving – help us prepare for Christ's victory on Easter.

- Prayer Try to read from the Bible one day a week. Maybe make it "Scripture Saturday" or "Scripture Sunday." Open the Bible to a page and point to a line on the page. Read it, reflect on what it is saying to you.
- Fasting On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, those aged 18 to 59, fast: eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. On the Fridays of Lent, as well as Ash Wednesday, those 14 and over should abstain from meat. But any age can do this during Lent.
- Almsgiving This is the giving of our time and resources to help others. Think about what you might do in those areas
 throughout the Lenten Season. What might you give up and save money from doing so? Where might you donate
 that money to help others?

Multiple names from the same person are acceptable and are considered one Intention. If the requested Mass is not available, we will advise you of other available dates.

Irreversible is not a word you want to hear from your Doctor but it's a common one if you've been diagnosed with Chemotherapy-Induced Peripheral Neuropathy or CIPN.

Elliott S. of Burlington survived testicular cancer only to be living life with constant pain. He felt as though he was walking on pins and needles, becoming weaker and weaker every day. "I was beginning to be worried that one day I would be wheelchair-bound."

Nearly half of patients who undergo chemotherapy will develop Chemotherapy-Induced Peripheral Neuropathy or CIPN.

Chemotherapy meds travel throughout the body and attack cancer cells; sadly they can also cause severe damage to healthy nerves. CIPN can begin within weeks of starting treatment and can worsen as treatment continues. Many people will endure the symptoms associated with CIPN for months, even years after they've completed chemo.

When asked how CIPN was affecting his quality of life, he responded, "It was difficult to even walk up and downstairs and do other things we usually take for granted."

The most common symptoms include:

- pain, tingling, burning, weakness, or numbness in arms, hands, legs or feet




