## From the Pastor's Desk

### Dear Parishioners,

We have just completed the First Communions of 78 Second Graders and we congratulate them and their families for this milestone. Next month our Sophomores will receive Confirmation. I would ask all of you to keep these students and their families in their prayers. Our Faith Formation Program wouldn't exist without volunteers so we congratulate them for a job well done.

As you know, the Easter Season doesn't end until Pentecost, when we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit. Throughout this time we read from the Acts of the Apostles and the spreading of the Church all over the Roman Empire. This happened not only because of the preaching of the Apostles but also because all Christians lived and shared their faith in the Risen Lord. We are called to do the same in our parish. In recognition of the need to evangelize, the Church has called upon all of us to become involved in Evangelization, a job for all and not just the clergy. Cardinal O'Malley instituted the Disciples of Mission Program for the Archdiocese of Boston, and from that every parish is to implement a Pastoral Plan.

We have had a very dedicated team who have developed our Pastoral Plan. I encourage you all to get involved in this so that our major concern will not be just maintaining our campuses but to the Mission of the Church.

St. Agnes Ceiling – The Facilities Department of the Archdiocese is working closely with structural engineers and a ceiling repair company to make a plan for the repair of the ceiling which I hope is sooner than later. For safety reasons, some of the benches will continue to be roped off.

I am pleased to share that our parish has raised \$63,735 toward our 2023 Catholic Appeal goal of \$87,800. Our heartfelt thanks to all who have helped get us closer to our goal. 



"It started out as a normal outing. My wife and I had to run to the grocery store. We were driving down the road casually going over our shopping list when the car ahead of me started to slow down anticipating the yellow light. "It started out as a normal outing. My wife and I had to run to the grocery store.
