

From the Parochial Vicar

Dear Parishioners and Extended Family Members,

Praised be Jesus Christ! He has risen! Truly, He has risen!

Well, we have reached that time of the year. It is important for many of us to plan a Summer that basically involves travel and / or some time for rest and relaxation.

If you have the chance to travel and / or have relaxation, good for you!! God has blessed you with the opportunity and the means to take advantage of it. As you anxiously look ahead in both anticipation and detailed planning through your research, I ask you, just as I asked the First Communicants of the Parish, to remember that you are not just composed of a body, **but a soul as well**. Summer vacation tends to be so focused on what is best for our bodies, that the soul can be in danger of being neglected.

So how do we help our souls as we prepare to enter into the "summer mindset"?

First, I would like to propose that the very fact we have the opportunity to plan for a summer event and have the means to make it happen is truly a gift from God. We do well to remember that all we have that is good is a gift from God. Even if we are convinced in our minds that we "earned" our summer vacation, the opportunity to take it is still - nonetheless - a gift from God. Waking up and thanking God each day, especially during your vacation, is not only spiritual, but an acknowledgement of reality. Fitting a local Sunday Mass into your schedule is giving God back one of the 168 hours in a week given to you, to vacation no less!

Secondly, may I suggest some summer reading. Of course, I would recommend the Bible. My personal starting places and, therefore, recommendations are:

- Gospel of Mark (action-packed)
- Acts of the Apostles (action adventure)
- Book of Jonah (short with humor),
- Letter of James (relationships)

There are also books on the Lives of the Saints. I would suggest a collection of brief writings and, if you feel so inclined by a particular account of a saint's life, then go purchase his / her biography / autobiography. There are also some excellent Catholic authors to choose from. Ronald Rolheiser, OMI is one of my favorites.

Lastly, please consider using the parish's electronic giving. By doing so, you may either have your credit card charged or an automatic withdrawal from you bank account according to the frequency that you are comfortable with. When you do this, your donations are recorded and very easily printed out at your request. When you use this manner, this expense is one which is 100% predictable and one which you can earn rewards for!

was asked how he managed to be so accurate and consistent. "I have to think like my receivers. It's as though we share the same brain and I am throwing the ball to myself. I know exactly where he is running and when he'll get to the point where I will throw the ball. That comes from lots of practice and spending time together." The key to their success came from acting as a team with one mind and one goal.

Jesus prays intensely for the unity of the Church. He knows the Father, has carried out His mission and shared it with the Apostles. Now, Jesus wants them to do the same. He has shown them the Father, given them a mission and wants them to share that message with others. Just as Jesus is one with the Father, He wants His Apostles to be one with Him and with each other. In union with Him, they will be in union with the Father and will be successful in completing the work entrusted to them.

Some people have an attitude that being spiritual is enough or that they do not need a church or community of faith. But Jesus prays for this. He knows that together we will accomplish great things. We will think and love and forgive with the mind and heart and spirit of Jesus. Remaining faithful to the Gospel and to our baptismal promises, we can become who we are called to be: the Body of Christ.

"SHE SAVED MY LIFE"

Burlington, MA resident Dawn R. had been experiencing the painful side effects of Peripheral Neuropathy, "my feet and legs were extremely painful and my doctor told me there was nothing they could do. That I would have to take Gabapentin for the rest of my life." Then she met Burlington's very own Acupuncturist Min Jeon Lic.Ac. D.Ac.

Peripheral Neuropathy is the pain, discomfort, and numbness caused by nerve damage of the peripheral nervous system. Dawn explained that daily tasks like opening doors and using the bathroom were overwhelmingly painful. "How can you live for the next 30 years when you don't even want to get out of bed to do simple things?"

She was experiencing the burning, numbness, tingling, and sharp pains that those suffering with neuropathy often describe. "The way that I would describe it, it's equivalent to walking on glass." You have difficulty walking, shopping or doing any activity for more than 30 minutes because of the pain. You're struggling with balance and living in fear that you might fall. Your doctor told you to 'just live with the pain' and you're taking medications that aren't working or have uncomfortable side effects.


