THOUGHTS ON TODAY'S READINGS

Authority and Humility - In the First Reading, the Lord speaks to Shebna, the master of the palace, and Eliakim, the chosen servant. Shebna's pride and misuse of authority lead to his removal, while Eliakim is granted his position. The Lord symbolically clothes Eliakim with Shebna's robe and sash, transferring authority to him.

Eliakim's humility is evident in his role. He becomes a father figure to Jerusalem's inhabitants and the house of Judah, representing guidance and care. The key placed upon his shoulder symbolizes his responsibility over the House of David, signifying his power to grant or deny access.

This reading teaches us about the balance between authority and humility. God rewards those who serve with humility and use their authority for the good of others. Like Eliakim, we should hold positions of honor while remaining grounded in humility, guiding and caring for others as entrusted by God.

Marveling at God's Wisdom - In the Second Reading, St. Paul reflects on the unfathomable riches, wisdom, and knowledge of God. The depth of God's judgments and His ways are beyond human comprehension.

Paul reminds us of the humility required before God's immense wisdom. No one can fully understand His mind or offer counsel to Him. God's gifts are freely given; nothing we offer can obligate Him.

"All things are from Him, through Him, and for Him." These words capture the essence of our existence in God's plan. Our purpose is to glorify Him forever. Paul's message invites us to stand in awe of God's wisdom and to recognize our place in His grand design.

Unveiling Our Understanding - In the Gospel Reading, Jesus asks his disciples, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" Their responses show various perceptions of Jesus. But then He directs the question to them directly, "But who do **YOU** say that I am?"

Who do I think Jesus is? A divine vending machine? I put in Mass time and prayers and get out heavenly rewards. An accountant? I need to make sure that on my life balance sheet my good deeds add up to more than my bad ones. A sponge? I tell him everything that is bothering me in life and let him absorb it. No response required. The list can go on and on.

Understanding Jesus is complex. Often, we might see Him as a sort of divine transactional figure, an all-forgiving ledger, or a silent listener. Yet, truly knowing Jesus is not solely in our control; it's a revelation. Just as Peter's understanding unfolded, our comprehension of Jesus comes over time, through experiences and prayer. Just when we feel we've grasped it, a new encounter can transform our understanding.

Considering this reveals the evolving nature of our relationship with Jesus. It reminds us that while our perceptions of

Him may change, the core of His love and purpose remains constant, waiting to be revealed to us as we journey through life.

St. Patrick's Breastplate: Christ With Me Prayer

St. Patrick's Breastplate is a prayer for protection and guidance. Christ is always with us providing us strength and wisdom. This is especially a good prayer for: Those who are in the military; People starting a new job in a new city; College students leaving home for the first time; Students in a new school; Those facing a spiritual crisis Teens finding it difficult to live their faith due to peer pressure; Anyone undergoing adversity.

This prayer is also known as The Deer's Cry or The Lorica of Saint Patrick or Saint Patrick's Hymn. There are several versions of this prayer. And different wordings are common.

St. Patrick's Breastplate (Short Version)

Christ with me, Christ before me,
Christ behind me, Christ in me,
Christ beneath me, Christ above me,
Christ on my right, Christ on my left,
Christ when I lie down, Christ when I sit down,
Christ when I arise,
Christ in the heart of every man who

thinks of me,

Christ in the mouth of everyone who speaks of me,

Christ in every eye that sees me, Christ in every ear that hears me.

From the Parochial Vicar

Dear Parishioners and Extended Family Members,

This Monday will be Holy Mother Church's memorial for St. Augustine of Hippo. Most of us associate St. Augustine with a particular former way of life. All the more reason to read on . . .

From *catholic.org*:

St. Augustine of Hippo is the patron of brewers because of his conversion from a former life of loose living, which included parties, entertainment, and worldly ambitions. His complete turnaround and conversion has been an inspiration to many who struggle with a particular vice or habit they long to break.

This famous son of St. Monica was born in Africa and spent many years of his life in wicked living and in false beliefs. Though he was one of the most intelligent men who ever lived and though he had been brought up a Christian, his sins of impurity and his pride darkened his mind so much that he could not see or understand the Divine Truth anymore. Through the prayers of his holy mother and the marvelous preaching of St. Ambrose, Augustine finally became convinced that Christianity was the one true religion. Yet he did not become a Christian then, because he thought he could never live a pure life. One day, however, he heard about two men who had suddenly been converted on reading the life of St. Antony, and he felt terribly ashamed of himself. "What are we doing?" he cried to his friend Alipius. "Unlearned people are taking Heaven by force, while we, with all our knowledge, are so cowardly that we keep rolling around in the mud of our sins!"

Full of bitter sorrow, Augustine flung himself out into the garden and cried out to God, "How long more, O Lord? Why does not this hour put an end to my sins?" Just then he heard a child singing, "Take up and read!" Thinking that God intended him to hear those words, he picked up the book of the Letters of St. Paul, and read the first passage his gaze fell on. It was just what Augustine needed, for in it, St. Paul says to put away all impurity and to live in imitation of Jesus. That did it! From then on, Augustine began a new life.

He was baptized, became a priest, a bishop, a famous Catholic writer, founder of religious priests, and one of the greatest saints that ever lived. He became very devout and charitable, too. On the wall of his room he had the following sentence written in large letters: "Here we do not speak evil of anyone." St. Augustine overcame strong heresies, practiced great poverty and supported the poor, preached very often, and prayed with great fervor right up until his death. "Too late have I loved You!" he once cried to God, but with his holy life he certainly made up for the sins he committed before his conversion.

We are all the more rich because of our faith due to the contributions of St. Augustine of Hippo, whether it be due to the teachings he has left the Church or because of his conversion story. Saint Augustine, pray for us!



THE UGLIER SIDE OF SHINGLES

Local Acupuncturist is treating shingles and post-shingles complications with amazing results.

Mothers have described it as a 'pain worse than labor', others compare it to passing a kidney stone.

THE UGLIER SIDE OF SHINGLES


