From the Parochial Vicar

Dear Parishioners and Extended Family Members,

Praised be Jesus Christ!

This past Saturday, we honored our nation's veterans. Fr. Steve led the opening prayer and the benediction in the ceremony held in Reading's Memorial Park. Whenever I am in the presence of a group of veterans, I am always awed at both the individual as well as the collective sacrifice they represent. Again, Thank you for your service!

This Thursday, Thanksgiving Day, Holy Mother Church celebrates Blessed Miguel Augustin Pro. Here is a description of his life:

Born on January 13, 1891 in Guadalupe, Mexico, Miguel Agustin Pro Juarez was the eldest son of Miguel Pro and Josefa Juarez.

Miguelito, as his doting family called him, was, from an early age, intensely spiritual and equally intense in hi mischievousness, frequently exasperating his family with his humor and practical jokes. As a child, he had a daring precociouness that sometimes went too far, tossing him into near-death accidents and illnesses. On regaining consciousness after one of these episodes, young Miguel opened his eyes and blurted out to his frantic parents, "I want some cocol" (a colloquial term for his favorite sweet bread). "Cocol" became his nickname, which he would later adopt as a code name during this clandestine ministry.

Miguel was particularly close to his older sister and after she entered a cloistered convent, he came to recognize his own vocation to the priesthood. Although he was popular with the senoritas and had prospects of a lucrative career managing his father's thriving business concerns, Miguel renounced everything for Christ his King and entered the Jesuit novitiate in El Llano, Michoacan in 1911.

He studied in Mexico until 1914, when a tidal wave of anti-Catholicism crashed down upon Mexico, forcing the novitiate to disband and flee to the United States, where Miguel and his brother seminarians treked through Texas and New Mexico before arriving at the Jesuit house in Los Gatos, California. - Youth Living Nativity, acting out the Gospel as it


- read. Roles include Mary, Joseph, the three Kings, the Star of Bethlehem, Shepherds, etc.

Climate Change is now the buzz word of every other

weather report - historic forest fires, floods, droughts,

storms, and disease spread. Climate change is pointed to

as a cause or an accelerant of these catastrophes. This

primer discusses the basic science of climate change and

how carbon dioxide (CO₂), the gas we exhale and the

crucial gas in photosynthesis, causes our planet to warm

and how that warming affects the world's climate and

weather.

This presentation is an opportunity for you to ask your questions in a safe and informal setting. Correctly understanding this process is critical as we discuss it with our family and friends. Pope Francis recently wrote an addendum to his encyclical *Laudato Si* called *Laudate Deum, To All People of Good Will on the Climate Crisis*. We will include his counsel in our discussion. A GIGANTIC THANK-YOU FOR A SUCCESSFUL CLOTHING DRIVE

Thank-you to all the Parishioners and those who prayed for a successful clothing drive.

With these Corporal Works of Mercy: feeding the poor and clothing the naked, we certainly exampled Faith in Action - (accomplished our goal!) - by helping people to spend less on clothing and allowing more money to be spent on food during these tough times.

It was astonishing the amount of winter clothes we collected in our fourth parish-wide event two weeks ago! We collected over 200 pairs of brand new socks and gloves, and over 100 brand new hats, as well as a HUGE number of used gloves and scarfs (many handmade). We received donations for Toddlers to Adults of all shapes and sizes. We also received many, many sweatshirts and coats, in addition to many needed boots.

Clothes have already headed up to Lazarus House and to two St. Vincent De Paul Stores - one newly opened in Woburn and another in Lowell. The homing pigeon prop did its job as so, so many people went home and brought back items and purchased new items.

As the days get colder and as winter approaches we what we accomplished in help so many people feel warmer day in and day out.






