From the Parochial Vicar

Dear Parishioners and Extended Family Members,

Praised be Jesus Christ!

As we enter into our last full week of the Season of Advent, I have been enlivened by the spirit of giving in each of our parish's churches. Your care for your neighbor, close and not-so-close by, is indeed commendable. Many thanks to the volunteers associated with these activities!

The name which gives us great comfort and hope during this season of preparation is Emmanuel. The name means "God with us." When we consider how God the Father asked his only Son to give up all in heaven in order to become one of us in order to teach, give us the example of how to live, then undergo his Passion and death in order to open the Gates of Heaven so we can live with God forever in heaven, we cannot help but come to a better understanding of just how much God loves us and, therefore, want him to be among us. This basic understanding of our faith is as important as ever. Let us make sure we keep it not only in our heads, but also in our hearts.

As I write you, we have just concluded First Reconciliation Services in our parish. This past Saturday, we celebrated with a total of about 45 students, and the Saturday preceding that, celebrated with another 50 students. In total we have over 90 students in this Sacramental year! It was wonderful to see the students there with their parents. They were well prepared and were happy to participate for the first time, in such an important sacrament. A great big thank you to the entire Faith Formation Department of our parish, especially Mrs. Paula Colpitts, and the parents /guardians!

Let us continue to join Pope Francis in praying Psalm 122, verse 6: "Pray for the peace of Jerusalem. May those who love you be secure." Bethlehem is just east of Jerusalem. Please include "a peace based on justice for the Holy Land" in your prayers.

FROM DARKNESS TO LIGHT, FROM SADNESS TO JOY

The holy season of Advent has arrived, and in eager anticipation, we are now on the joyful four-week journey to Christmas. But it is not always easy to be joyful.

During Advent, the Church pays special attention to the struggle between darkness and light. December is one of the cloudiest months of the year, and the gloomy, gray, dreary, overcast skies can dampen our spirits. Moreover, the days keep getting shorter up to the winter solstice — the shortest day of the year when the light is the least and the darkness is the greatest. The heaviness of the darkness can lead to sadness and feeling down in the dumps.

But there are many ways to counteract the bleakness and desolation.

Pray. Stay close to Jesus, who is the light of the world (John 8:12; 12:46), the light shining in the darkness (John 1:5).

The Advent Wreath serves as a reminder of the Light of Christ. Each week as the outdoor light diminishes, one additional candle is lit on the Advent Wreath to symbolize how the light of Christ crowds out the darkness, which gives us reason to have exultant spirits and joyful hearts.

Another rich source of light is ourselves. Jesus tells us, "You are the light of the world" (Matthew 5:14). When we are kind to one another and do good deeds, our light is set on a lamp stand for all to see (Matthew 5:15), and as our light illumines the house, we spread joy.

May the light of Christ fill your hearts with gladness as we prepare to celebrate the great feast of Christmas!

THE THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT: THE STORY BEHIND THE PINK ADVENT CANDLE

As the commercial world is already saturated with red and green, it's easy to lose sight of the true colors of the season—the Advent season. Three of the four weeks of Advent are violet while the Third Week is pink (rose). Violet symbolizes sorrow for sin and serves as a reminder to prepare for Christmas through the admission, confession, and absolution of sin during Advent, and to be in the state of grace, ready to welcome the Christ when he comes. The rose candle is lit on the Third Sunday of Advent, Gaudete Sunday, and it represents joy, the joy that Jesus is almost here.





Families, and especially children, have a way of anticipating big events. Big games, vacations, graduations, special birthdays and important holidays and anniversaries are thoroughly discussed and given scrupulous planning. Dreams and plans become daily

talk and slowly but surely the big day draws closer. Half the excitement is in anticipating and dreaming of the big day.

Even the commercial aspect of Christmas contributes to the excitement of the day. Children imagine gifts of all sorts and plan what they will do on that special morning. Decorations, music, and the dreaded crowded malls boost our spirits. It's a great time to discuss what can be done for others, especially the poor, the lonely, the forgotten and the needy. Big plans are so much better when we share our joy and our blessings with others. So, plan something worthwhile. Visit a nursing home or an elderly neighbor. Clean out unused toys and games and give them to social services or someplace that can use them. Make some Christmas dinners and share them with those who have none. Anticipate the joy of Christmas by planning to share it with those who really need it.

Like the expectant Mary and Joseph, we all
have a piece of God to bring into this world.

We have been created and as such, the

seeds of our creative possibilities remain within our core. How do we harvest these? How do we ready them? How do we audaciously trust that we have a "yes" to issue as well?

One way to begin is to put ourselves into the story of God: Picture the manger scene. We can imagine the animals and even the angels. We can hear the cry of the newborn baby and feel the relief of his parents. We can see the star bright in the sky. But can we find ourselves within its rays? Where do we fit into this familiar miracle? Christ was born unto us. What does this mean? As we look for our place in the scene, we will ready ourselves to respond more deeply to it.

Advent Reflection: Use a few of these questions to prompt your reflection:

- If Mary's "yes" to God led to Joseph's, where do they both lead you?
- What do you imagine that God is growing in your life right now?
- Where in your life do you need Christ to enter the most?
- What is God's invitation to you? How is it unbelievable? How is actually very possible?
- What will you co-create with God this year?
- What will change in your life when you say "yes"? What will stay the same?

Prayer Prompt

Prayer is the practice of attending to that which is true. When we pray, whatever method we use, we notice our needs, our desires, and our relationships more. Only by noticing what is within are we able to connect with that which is beyond ourselves. As such, prayer is our participation in the deepening of the sacred. We practice this when we say, "yes." We invite you to finish this prayer:

Today, Yes is my prayer. It is my Amen.

My Peace Be with You. Yes is my belief in all things possible.

God, hear my "yes" as I listen to yours... (write or imagine how God is affirming you—saying yes to you and the needs of your life.)
