Dear Parishioners,

On behalf of the Staff of Christ the King Parish, I wish you a very Merry Christmas and a Blessed New Year.

You hear us quite often talk about the Good News, but with all the negative news around us we might be tempted to say, "What's so good about it!" As we read in the Scripture, "There is nothing new under the sun," and this is why the Church gives us the Advent Season to help us cut through all the distractions that we worry about and encourages us to refocus on what the Good News really is. 

Irreversible is not a word you want to hear from your Doctor but it's a common one if you've been diagnosed with Chemotherapy-Induced Peripheral Neuropathy or CIPN.







