



#### HONORING OUR PATRON SAINTS: SAINT AGNES AND SAINT ATHANASIUS

This weekend we honor the Patron Saints of our Churches: Saint Agnes and Saint Athanasius. Saint Agnes' Feast Day is Saturday, January 21. All major Christian denominations which officially recognize saints venerate St. Athanasius. Western Christians observe his feast day on 2 May, the anniversary of his death. The Catholic Church considers Athanasius a Doctor of the Church and observes his feast day on May 2. Eastern Orthodox liturgical calendars remember St. Athanasius on January 18th. Our Liturgy Committee determined to honor Saint Athanasius around the January 18 Feast Day, as Easter time and restrictions makes it more challenging.



Athanasius led a tumultuous but dedicated life of service to the Church. He was the great champion of the faith against the widespread heresy that Jesus was not truly divine. Five times Athanasius was exiled for his defense of the doctrine of Christ's divinity. He is titled a "Doctor of the Church."

On January 18, the Orthodox Church honors the memory of St. Athanasius the Great, Patriarch of Alexandria from 328 until 373 AD.

Reflection: Athanasius suffered many trials while he was bishop of Alexandria. He was given the grace to remain strong against what probably seemed at times to be insurmountable opposition. Athanasius lived his office as bishop completely. He defended the true faith for his flock, regardless of the cost to himself. In today's world we are experiencing this same call to remain true to our faith, no matter what.



Almost nothing is known of this saint except that she was very young—12 or 13—when she was martyred in the last half of the third century.
Legend has it that Agnes was a beautiful girl whom many young men wanted to marry.
Among those she refused, one reported her to the authorities for being a

Christian. She was arrested and confined to a house of prostitution. The legend continues that a man who looked upon her lustfully lost his sight and had it restored by her prayer. Agnes was condemned, executed, and buried near Rome in a catacomb that eventually was named after her. The daughter of Constantine built a basilica in her honor.

Reflection: Like that of Maria Goretti in the 20th century, the martyrdom of a virginal young girl made a deep impression on a society enslaved to a materialistic outlook. Also like Agatha, who died in similar circumstances, Agnes is a symbol that holiness does not depend on length of years, experience, or human effort. It is a gift God offers to all.

#### **PRAYERS FOR VOCATIONS**

Give them courage and strength to follow God's holy will. Guide their uncertain steps, strengthen their resolutions, shield their chastity, fashion their minds, conquer their hearts, and lead them to the vineyards where they will labor in God's holy service. Amen.


