From the Parochial Vicar

Dear Parishioners and Extended Family Members,

Praised be Jesus Christ!

Next weekend we will be asked to pledge to the Catholic Appeal for 2024. This pledge drive, is for the Archdiocese the equivalent of our parish's weekly collection. Our collaborative is part of a bigger picture. The Archdiocese of Boston includes 251 Parishes in 144 Cities and Towns. It provides leadership, governance, and services for parishes and individuals. Of those parishes, 167 Boston priests oversee 221 of the parishes. Of the remaining 30 parishes, religious order priests oversee 15 parishes and priests from other dioceses oversee the remaining 15. While the parish is the focus of church life, parishes cannot do everything on their own. This is especially true when you consider the number of priests and the multiple parishes they are responsible for, whether it be pastorally or administratively. Parishes, therefore, look to the Archdiocese for services and support. Altogether, the Catholic Appeal supports over 50 Ministries and Agencies. These programs help thousands of people on a daily basis, Catholic and non-Catholic alike.

If you have given in the past, I humbly ask you to please keep up your level of generosity for this year as well. If you have not given, then I ask you to please consider doing so. Father Steve along with our entire parish staff rely on the Archdiocese's counsel. This can regard anything from the maintenance of both churches' physical plants to advising priests when a couple wants to marry outside of the Archdiocese. This support enables us to "remain on task" rather than getting "bogged down" trying to figure out what we are not clear about. I ask that you prayerfully consider supporting the Archdiocese of Boston in both their efforts to support parishes and in their outreach efforts.

Please keep our parish's Confirmation students in prayer. The second year students of our parish will be on retreat next weekend. They are the future of the Church. They will be receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation one month after the retreat, the first weekend after Easter. Personally, I am a little embarrassed to say that I cannot believe how much the world has changed since I received the sacrament. The young people of our parish face so many more challenges. May they learn to keep God in their lives. Come Holy Spirit!

In closing, I wish to bring your attention to two movies very much worth seeing, "Ordinary Angels" starring Hillary Swank (presently in theaters), and "Cabrini", in theaters March 8. They are guaranteed to boost your spirit and moral!!

CHRIST THE KING CHALICE PROGRAM

The purpose of the Chalice Program is to encourage families to pray and promote vocations to the Priesthood and Religious Life. The consecrated Chalice is a tangible reminder of this special intention for the Church. The Second Vatican Council highlights the responsibility of the laity to pray for and support vocations.

Praying for vocations is the most powerful way to support vocations. A vocation is a call from the Holy Spirit, a gift from God that is nurtured in prayer. When we pray for vocations, we lift up to our Father those men

and women whom He is calling to follow Him in a very special way. We hope that those who bring the chalice home will continue to pray daily for vocations.

Every two weeks, a family who volunteers is invited up to the altar at the conclusion of the Prayers of the Faithful to receive the Consecrated Chalice and a blessing from the

Priest. The family takes the chalice home and puts it in a place of honor, praying during the two weeks for an increase and perseverance of vocations. After two weeks, the family will return the chalice for another family to take home. We will begin the Christ the King Chalice Program the weekend of March 23/24 on Palm Sunday.

PRAYERS FOR VOCATIONS

Give them courage and strength to follow God's holy will. Guide their uncertain steps, strengthen their resolutions, shield their chastity, fashion their minds, conquer their hearts, and lead them to the vineyards where they will labor in God's holy service. Amen.

TAIZÉ PRAYER SERVICE WEDNESDAY, MARCH 6 7:30 PM - St. Agnes Church

Taizé Prayer offers a quiet, meditative time for personal reflection toward Spiritual growth during the Lenten Season. It is not a long service - lasting just about one-half hour. Coming to Taizé is to be invited to search for communion with God through community prayer, song, silence, and personal reflection.

BRING YOUR TROUBLES TO THE LORD

You will find signs, note papers and baskets at each door of both churches for people wishing to bring their troubles to the Lord. These will be collected until the Triduum and burnt in the Holy Fire at the Easter Vigil.

THE EASTER VIGIL HOLY FIRE: DID YOU KNOW?

The first major section of the annual Easter Vigil celebration may be the most memorable and engaging to the senses. It certainly includes some vivid



symbols and actions which we do not encounter in the liturgy every day. Formerly called simply the "Service of Light", in the present English translation of the third edition of the Roman Missal this introductory sequence of liturgical elements is entitled "The Solemn Beginning of the Vigil or Lucernarium". The solemn liturgy begins – usually outdoors – with the blessing of the fire followed by the preparation and lighting of the Paschal Candle.

FASTING WELL ON OUR LENTEN JOURNEY

Lent Is About More Than Food - While Lent fasting brings to mind fasting from certain types or amounts of food, the Lenten season calls for much more. Fasting must be joined with prayer and almsgiving, which itself can take several forms, including donating our money or giving of our time with works of service. As with exercising restraint at the table, almsgiving, too, must be performed in a godly spirit of self-giving rather than calculated solely for personal gain (a tax write-off) or adulation (special recognition for charitable donations). Finally, Lent is a time of forgiveness; we must have compassion toward others if we expect compassion from God. Three Conditions for Fasting Well

In his 1622 Ash Wednesday sermon, St. Francis de Sales sets forth three conditions for fasting well ("Sermon for Ash Wednesday, February 9, 1622," Sermons of St. Francis de Sales for

Lent (TAN Books 1987)):

"I thought of speaking to you of the conditions which render fasting good and meritorious. Understand that of itself fasting is not a virtue. It is a virtue only when it is accompanied by conditions which render it pleasing to God.

We find some people who think that to fast well during the holy season of Lent it is enough to abstain from eating some prohibited food. We know very well that it is not enough to fast exteriorly if we do not also fast interiorly, and if we do not accompany the fast of the body with that of the spirit.

Now among all the conditions required for fasting well, I will select 3 principal ones...

The first condition is that we must fast with our whole heart, willingly, wholeheartedly, universally and entirely. The second condition is never to fast through vanity but always through humility.

The third condition necessary for fasting well is to look to God and to do everything to please Him, withdrawing within ourselves in imitation of a great saint, St. Gregory the Great, who withdrew into a secret place where he remained for a time."

These conditions, particularly the third, should direct our minds to the reality that we are always dependent on God. Fasting should always lead us to a conversion of the heart. If fasting separates us from our brothers and sisters, or becomes an occasion for pride, then the conditions of fasting well have not been met. Similarly, if we are inclined to take the easy path, fasting only according to the letter of the law rather than the spirit, then it is not possible to say that we have fasted with our whole heart directed toward God.



PREPARING FOR THE TRIDUUM AT CHRIST THE KING

The summit of the Liturgical Year is the Easter Triduum—from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery.

The single celebration of the Triduum marks the end of the Lenten season, and leads to the Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord at the Easter Vigil. (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops)






