## **Frequently Asked Questions**

Q: Can I take pictures and videos during the ceremony?

**A:** Photography and videotaping are allowed as a means to capture the memory of this special day. Please respect the sacred nature of the baptism by limiting distractions like flash and sound.

Q: Does my child need to wear white?

**A:** Many children do wear traditional Christening garments; however, you may dress your child as you would like. A simple white garment will be provided by the church for the ceremony--handmade by loving parishioners.

Q: What else is required before the baptism?

**A:** If this is your first child to be baptized in the Catholic Church, you must attend a baptism preparation class before the baptism. The preparation class is also referred to as a parent meeting. Additionally, you are asked to attend a parent meeting if it has been longer than three years since you've had a child baptized. The baptism coordinator will discuss upcoming class dates with you, or you can call the parish office to register.

Q: Is there a fee for a baptism?

**A:** There is no fee; however many families wish to offer a donation on the occasion of their child's baptism. This may be mailed to the office, sent on <u>WeShare</u> or <u>Venmo</u>, or given to the clergy on the day of the baptism.

Q: How long is the 1:00 PM Baptism Service?

**A:** Depending on the number of persons being baptized (maximum of 6 babies), the service typically lasts about 45 minutes to an hour.

Q: What do I need if I am not married?

**A:** A birth certificate of the person to be baptized is required by Massachusetts state law. Please submit to the parish office prior to the baptismal date.

Q: Are people of different faiths welcome?

A: Yes, this is a celebration for you and your family. Everyone is welcome.

Q: What if a godparent can't be present at the baptismal ceremony?

**A:** A family member or friend can stand in at the ceremony as a proxy for the absent godparent, but the godparent's name will appear in the official baptismal record.
