Catholic Charities East Bay

We provide housing, immigration legal, and mental health services to people of all backgrounds and faiths. Mental health services are by referral and specific to participating schools and cities. We are a non-profit, 501(c)(3) social services agency serving Alameda and Contra Costa Counties with offices in Oakland, Richmond, and Concord.

- **Housing:** rent relief to low-income families and seniors facing eviction or with back-rent due to COVID-19; may include help paying utilities or security deposits. Call or visit website to apply for help.
- Food distributions: once a month in Richmond. Visit website for dates.
- Immigration Legal Services: helping clients earn lawful working status and follow a path to citizenship. Our attorneys also represent unaccompanied minors and people facing removal proceedings. Call for appointments.
- Mental Health (by referral):
 - Experience Hope in Schools: culturally responsive approaches to help students overcome the trauma of pervasive violence and racism. Available at participating schools in Oakland Unified and West Contra Costa Unified School districts.
 - **Crisis Response Services:** counseling and support for surviving family/friends who loved ones lost to homicide in Oakland.
 - Family Support Services: counseling and case management for parents and children referred to us by Contra Costa County Children and Family Services to improve child well-being and strengthen families.
 - TRUE Academy: help young people within the Alameda County juvenile
 justice system learn strategies to safely and productively think and respond to
 situations of stress, fear, and conflict.

- Available to interested groups or individuals:
 - Day Star: education and mentoring connecting youth surviving or at risk of commercial sexual exploitation (CSEC) to adult mentors and to increase awareness of CSEC and decrease demand.

SERVICES:
