Dramatic Arts Program Manager (% time)

Department Leadership:

• Provide strategic direction and leadership for the Drama Team, including, curriculum development, production planning, departmental initiatives, and ensuring the organization and safety of the theater, black box, and workshop.

 Collaborate with school administration, faculty, and staff to integrate theatrical arts into the broader educational experience and uphold the school's mission and values.

Directing Plays and Musicals:

• Direct and oversees major theatrical productions, including show selection, casting, rehearsals, choreography, music, set design, and technical coordination.

Student Mentorship and Development:

- Provide individualized and group guidance, feedback, and support to students participating in theatrical productions and enrolled in theater classes.
- Foster a culture of creativity, collaboration, and mutual respect, nurturing the artistic talents and personal growth of each student.

Community Engagement:

- Promote theatrical productions and departmental activities within the school community and beyond, cultivating interest and participation in the dramatic arts.

- Proven experience in directing theatrical productions and teaching theater classes, preferably in an educational or youth-focused setting.
- Strong understanding of theater techniques, production processes, and curriculum development.
- Comprehensive knowledge of theater production processes, including acting, directing, stagecraft, and technical elements.
- Excellent communication, organizational, and leadership skills.
- Strong leadership, organizational, and communication skills, with the ability to inspire and motivate students and colleagues.
- Ability to work collaboratively within the theater department and with students, staff, parents and community members
- Commitment to fostering a supportive and inclusive learning environment grounded in Catholic values.
- Passion for theater arts education and a commitment to fostering creativity, empathy, and self-expression in students.
- Passion for inspiring creativity, promoting artistic excellence, and nurturing talent in young performers.

Physical Requirements
