FR. DEL... POINTS TO PONDER

You know more than you think you know about our Catholic faith. Seriously, you do. For some reason, there is a movement afoot in the Church that reminds Catholics of their ignorance about the faith. "If only we could get people to memorize the essentials of our faith, then we would be a better Church." I think we can be so negative about what we



understand as a Church because people do not use the "code words" that serve as a litmus test of orthodoxy. But if we listen to people, really listen to people, Catholics today have a longing to understand their faith and come to a deeper relationship with Christ. People are longing for meaning in today's world.

Here's what I mean. I recently had the privilege of sitting with a group of parents in our Family of Faith Program. Parents meet once a month while their children are in class. The idea of these parent meetings is that parents can reflect on their own faith, and the Church's teaching, so that they can hand that on to their children. We were talking about holiness and the saints. It is November, after all. The parents *really do* understand their desire for their children to grow up with knowledge of the faith and love for Christ.

One parent expressed that she wanted her children to understand that they need to do the right thing for other people and expect nothing in return. That parent knows her faith! OK, she did not use terms like "virtue ethics," nor did she use St. Thomas' language of "virtue is its own reward." But she did not need to! The teaching of the Church regarding character formation, sacrificial love, and basic Christian civility was innate. That is what matters.

I am afraid that well-intentioned lovers of the faith are sometimes giving us false expectations, thinking that unless we use specific code words, then we do not really know the faith when we actually do. Not that we cannot all learn more about what we believe, but it is a process, not an indoctrination. This is why we call it a *life of faith*.

We all have co-responsibility to be excited enough about our faith that we want to continue to develop an understanding of God's goodness, even if we do not use the specific theological terms. In other words, **you know more than you know**. This is the foundation for our whole understanding of how much there is to learn about our faith, and ways that we have yet to be formed.

If there is anything that *Beacons of Light* can challenge us to do and be, it is to create a positive, exciting environment where we *want* to grow in our faith. We can build on that seed that God placed in us at our Baptism. We do not have to defend anything about what the Church teaches. Christ is strong enough to take care of that. And we do not have to be stymied by the so-called right answers, not if we are truly alive in Christ. The Truth will constantly be revealed to us. Our role is to share our beliefs with others, so that it can grow for the common good.

OH, NOW I GET IT!

What in the world are next Sunday's readings about?



OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

Ez 34:11-12, 15-17 The metaphor of a king being a shepherd in the Old Testament era was common, not only for the Jews, but throughout other cultures. In the verses before this passage, Ezekial explained that the kings of Israel had greatly failed as true shepherds; now in his great love, God will be their shepherd, and He will gather the sheep who are lost and heal the wounded among them, tending especially to the weak and broken. SLEEK & THE STRONG: The leaders of society who use and oppress the weaker sheep. God will judge the sheep for their own behavior. RAMS & GOATS: Rams (male sheep) are to protect the other sheep; goats are seen as oppressors of the sheep.

I Cor 15:20-26, 28 The lordship and kingship of Jesus is rooted in His divine nature and His conquest of sin and death, entities created by Adam's sin. We who are baptized share in Christ's death and Resurrection. (Paschal Mystery) When Christ returns at the end of time, His eternal sovereignty will fully be revealed, and He will hand all that exists over to His Father (not because He is not equal to the Father, but because He the loving Son who gives His Father this gift.)

Mt 25:31-46 Jesus describes the day of His return when He, as Son of Man (Messiah) and THE king, will render judgment on the world ("all the nations"). SHEEP VS. GOATS: This is an old Jewish image of good vs. evil. The criterion for judgment is how each person treated Christ present in others. His presence is found not necessarily in those who are attractive or beneficial to us, but in those in need. Those who honor and love Christ present in the needy will live in His kingdom because they already honor Him. Those who do not love Christ in others will come to eternal damnation. (Notice the connection of the first reading and the Gospel concerning the sheep who do not protect the weaker sheep.)

Your decision to live as a kingdom person is now. Where are you called to actively respond to the least of your brothers and sisters?

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is scheduled on Sundays, either at Mass or at 12:30 p.m. Expectant parents should plan on attending the Baptismal Preparation Program, held six times a year. Call the Parish Office to schedule the Baptism and Preparation

The Sacrament of Baptism for adults and school-age children is usually celebrated at the Easter Vigil, along with the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist. Preparation occurs in steps and stages throughout the year. Call Elizabeth Otte at 513-882-6515 for more information.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

The Sacrament of Penance (Reconciliation or Confession) is celebrated each Saturday, 2:30-3:30 p.m., or by appointment with the pastor. Seasonal Penance Services are also celebrated.

The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick may be scheduled by calling the pastor before a medical procedure, or in the event of a serious illness, and after all Masses when there are five weekends in the month. When hospitalized, please notify the Parish Office; this is the only way we know if a parishioner has been hospitalized. In case of medical emergency or death, call the Parish Office and follow prompts. SACRAMENTS OF COMMITMENT

The Sacrament of Marriage is scheduled by calling the pastor or deacon to begin the process of marriage preparation at least six months prior to the anticipated wedding date. A date for the wedding is set only after meeting with the pastor or deacon.

Discernment for the Sacrament of Orders (ordination to the Priesthood and Diaconate) is facilitated by contacting the pastor or Vocation Director of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. Those interested in pursuing Religious Life may also make these contacts.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM
