FR. DEL... POINTS TO PONDER

All great spirituality is about what we do with our pain. If we do not transform our pain, we will transmit it to those around us. You have probably heard these words before because they are so central to the challenges that human beings face. How we face the pain of life determines how spiritually fit we choose to be.

A less than healthy approach may use the spiritual life to avoid dealing with ourselves, our pain, or the reality of the world. Avoidance is not a substitute for the real purpose of developing a healthy spiritual life: relationship with Christ.

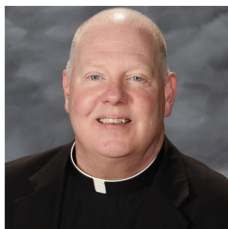
A healthy approach to prayer, to our relationship with God, and the way we face our life, is rooted in honesty and forthrightness, even if it is painful. In her book, *Help, Thanks, Wow: The Three Essential Prayers*, Ann Lamott reminds the reader that prayer is only real when it is honest, saying the things that are true, not just the words that we think God wants to hear. In down-to-earth terms she states,

“My belief is that when you’re telling the truth, you’re close to God. If you say to God, ‘I am exhausted and depressed beyond words, and I don’t like You at all right now, and I recoil from most people who believe in You,’ that might be the most honest thing you’ve ever said. If you told me you had said to God, ‘It is all hopeless, and I don’t have a clue if You exist, but I could use a hand,’ it would almost bring tears to my eyes, tears of pride in you, for the courage it takes to get real – really real. It would make me want to sit next to you at the dinner table.”

One of the most prominent and powerful unclean spirits that can affect our world today is humanity’s inability to live in an honesty that is rooted in the common good. Like the man possessed with a demon in today’s Gospel, the gift we need may need most is the gift to ask Jesus the tough questions of life: *What have you to do with us? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are!*

May we be courageous enough to transform the pain of evil spirits, rather than transmit the evil spirits of our lives on to others.

OH, NOW I GET IT!

Have you ever thought at Mass, "What in the world is this reading about?" Each week, you can learn some background to make sense of the Scripture for the next Sunday that may be hard to understand.

FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Job 7:1-4, 6-7 Job, beset with the loss of everything he had in the world, mourns as one who sees no end to his suffering and sees how people – slaves, the poor workers, and those whose lives are heavy burdened – live without hope.

1 Cor 9:16-19, 22-23 Prior to these verses, Paul urges Christians to give up practices which in themselves are moral, but are misunderstood by less mature Christians and lead them into sin. He uses himself as a model. **NO REASON TO BOAST:** Paul did not earn apostleship; it is imposed on him by Christ. If he does it, Christ will reward him. **FULL USE OF MY RIGHT IN THE GOSPEL:** Christ stated that the laborer is worth his pay and had other rights as God's minister, but Paul refuses to accept these, so that he may lead others to Christ. No one can claim that Paul is working for his own material gain; with no wages paid to him, he is like a slave. He seeks to live like those he serves, no matter the cost to himself. His reward will come in sharing the Gospel, i.e., the salvation Christ has brought to us.

Mk 1:29-39 LAY SICK WITH A FEVER: With the lack of medical knowledge, fevers could easily lead to death. By healing Peter's mother-in-law's fever and the subsequent ailments brought to Him, Jesus is breaking the power of evil which causes suffering, such as we read in the first reading. A disciple, such as Peter's mother-in-law, responds in grateful service for the healing Jesus brings. Jesus goes off to pray, for it is in union with His Father that He can act, and it is in union with the Father that He ministers. Jesus maintains the discipline of His call: not to make everyone's problems go away, but to draw humanity into the life of God; healings and exorcisms are not His purpose, but are rather signs of His power over evil, which show His credibility to proclaim the Gospel which will lead people to the fullness of life beyond this world.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK:

Peter's mother-in-law's response to being healed is to serve. How might you serve others more directly in response to Christ's healing presence?

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

The **Sacrament of Baptism for infants** is scheduled on Sundays, either at Mass or at 12:30 p.m. Expectant parents should plan on attending the Baptismal Preparation Program, held six times a year. Call the Parish Office to schedule the Baptism and Preparation Program.

The **Sacrament of Baptism for adults and school-age children** is usually celebrated at the Easter Vigil, along with the **Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist**. Preparation occurs in steps and stages throughout the year. Call Elizabeth Otte at 513-882-6515 for more information.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

The **Sacrament of Penance** (Reconciliation or Confession) is celebrated each Saturday, 2:30-3:30 p.m., or by appointment with the pastor. Seasonal Penance Services are also celebrated.

The **Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick** may be scheduled by calling the pastor before a medical procedure, or in the event of a serious illness, and **after all Masses when there are five weekends in the month**. When hospitalized, please notify the Parish Office; this is the only way we know if a parishioner has been hospitalized. In case of medical emergency or death, call the Parish Office and follow prompts.

SACRAMENTS OF COMMITMENT

The **Sacrament of Marriage** is scheduled by calling the pastor or deacon to begin the process of marriage preparation at least six months prior to the anticipated wedding date. A date for the wedding is set only after meeting with the pastor or deacon.

Discernment for the **Sacrament of Orders** (ordination to the Priesthood and Diaconate) is facilitated by contacting the pastor or Vocation Director of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. Those interested in pursuing Religious Life may also make these contacts.


RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM


