• Member Report Discussion

- Fr. Del Remarks You all know that all public Masses have been suspended, as well as all activities at the parish. We will be Facebook Live streaming the 9:30am Mass on Sundays in the interim.

It states that dates/times for decorating church are to be published in the bulletin so that others may join in on decorating. This is not something that I have been doing. The question is whether this should be done or can we delete those sentences from the A&E description?

All looks good to me, although I do have a couple of questions/suggestions.

1. In regard to the scheduling of liturgical ministers for the special Masses, (Confirmation, First Communion, Girl Scout Sunday, Boy Scout Sunday, etc.), if we have these Masses scheduled in the fall (as

suggested), we should simply also schedule the special ministers at that time. That way we won't have to "unask" the regularly scheduled ministers, they will simply have a bye week scheduled. That would hopefully eliminate confusion and the awkward situation of "unasking".

- 2. To follow up with Peggy's feedback on the Stations, maybe next year we could rotate using different versions of the stations each week. I'm guessing different people have different favorites. Do we have books for other versions? Just a suggestion....
- 3. Also, follow up on Peggy's feedback regarding Ash Wednesday. The 7pm prayer service was also very well attended. Although the service was very nice, several people (particularly choir members) mentioned their disappointment that it was not a Mass. Maybe this topic can be revisited for next year.
