
3rd Scrutiny (11:30am liturgy only)

The scrutinies are intercessory prayers for the elect, helping them to search their minds and hearts to get rid of whatever holds them back from Christ and to deepen their love of him. As the scrutinies progress, the elect now place themselves with Lazarus in the tomb, about to meet Christ the Resurrection and the Life. We pray that Jesus will "free from the grasp of death those who await your life-giving sacraments." In baptism the elect will, like Lazarus, be raised to new life with Christ and share in the power of his resurrection.
