## THE NATIVITY OF THE LORD

**Domingo 25 de Diciembre 2016**

**La Natividad del Señor**

**Isaías 52,7-10:** Verán los confines de la tierra la victoria de nuestro Dios

**Salmo 97:** Los confines de la tierra han contemplado la victoria de nuestro Dios.

**Hebreos 1,1-6:** Dios nos ha hablado por el Hijo

**Juan 1,1-18:** La Palabra se hizo hombre y habitó entre nosotros.

El prólogo de San Juan nos recuerda que aquel que ha nacido es el mismo que, desde toda la eternidad ya era Dios. La genealogía recordaba la historia de Israel, conducida por una promesa hecha a Abrahán, profundizada en David y conservada después del destierro. José es el último eslabón de aquella cadena; el que recibe el anuncio definitivo: *Le pondrás por nombre Jesús, porque el salvará al pueblo de los pecados.* Aquella historia, llena de avatares y no exenta de infidelidades y pecados, no seguía un destino caprichoso. Dios la conducía con su providencia ordenándolo todo hasta lo que San Pablo llama *la plenitud de los tiempos.* El deseo alimentado en el corazón de tantas generaciones se encuentra ahora con el deseo mantenido en el seno de Dios desde toda la eternidad en ese preciso instante en que *el Verbo se hizo carne y habitó entre nosotros.*

La celebración de la Navidad nos introduce en el misterio de la ternura de Dios. Cuando contemplamos el nacimiento en Belén, sobrecoje el modo maravilloso que Dios ha elegido para venir a visitarnos. Los elementos físicos son muy elementales. Vemos una cueva y un pesebre. No hay nada que pueda distraer nuestra atención. La pobreza, el silencio, lo escondido del lugar y la misma noche que invitan al recogimiento centran toda nuestra atención en el Niño que yace entre pajas. Podemos decir con San Pablo *ha aparecido la bondad de Dios y su amor al hombre.* El Dios que nos ama desde toda la eternidad se nos ha acercado.

El, que ha nacido en pobreza, se da a conocer en primer lugar a gente humilde. Los pastores son los primeros en conocer la feliz noticia. Dormían al raso. Es decir, no se protegían. Y, cuando reciben el anuncio del ángel corren hacia Belén. No hay nada que les impida creer. De ellos podemos aprender esa sencillez y apertura a la manifestación de Dios. ¡Tantas veces nos protegemos temiendo perder algo! Pero el cielo no baja sobre la tierra para aplastarlo, sino que como dijo San Ambrosio, el quiso estar en la tierra, para que tu alcanzaras las estrellas.

Contemplando a la Virgen María y a San José que custodian al Niño, advertimos también que Jesús es la Buena noticia que ha de ser anunciada a todos los hombres. Ellos lo aman sin poseerlo. Reflejan el mismo amor de Jesús, que ha venido para dar vida a los hombres; para ofrecerse el mismo en sacrificio por nosotros y quedarse como alimento en la

Eucaristía. El detalle del pesebre ha sido leído por los padres como lugar para la comida y también como imagen de la cruz o de la tumba en la que Jesús será sepultado. Acompañados de María y José comprendemos ese amor de Dios que se abaja naciendo para que también nosotros tengamos un nuevo nacimiento. Y sentimos la exigencia del amor que, a imitación de Cristo, debe acercarnos a los más necesitados. En Belén, viendo cómo Dios nos ama, empezamos a aprender a amar. Dios se ha hecho pequeño para que no temamos nada. Sea cual sea nuestra situación, todo puede ser nuevo *por que un niño nos ha nacido, un hijo se nos ha dado.*
