

**Hospitality is True Christianity**

The First Reading focuses on the importance of hospitality in being a true Christian. The story is about Abraham being visited by God, accompanied by two angels (all three visitors are disguised as three strangers traveling in the desert). Later on in Christianity, this was understood to be the three Persons of the Blessed Trinity. Lack of hospitality is considered one of the greatest sins and one of the reasons for the destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah. Abraham's *gracious hospitality* to his three guests was richly rewarded with the fulfillment of God's promise to Abraham of a son, within a year. Abraham is the model of true Christianity demonstrated by gracious hospitality. This true sign of Christianity is especially important in the desert of our world. • The Responsorial continues the theme of hospitality: welcoming God into one's home. The Psalm asks who can host the Lord? Only the one who lives morally, charitably, harming no one, who thinks and speaks the truth without gossip, associating only with those who live by God's ways, and not profiting at another's loss, nor selling justice. • In the Second Reading the question is asked, what could be lacking in the sufferings of Christ? By trusting when we suffer, we make Christ's suffering present and alive again in ourselves and we become sacraments of His passion. Knowing God's will is far beyond our humanity, yet this is precisely what has been revealed in Christ. In His death and resurrection, we have learned how much God loves us and of the glory He has prepared for us. • In the Alleluia Verse we see that the most fertile heart generously keeps God's word and persevering, yields a rich harvest. • In the Gospel, we find the story of Martha and Mary and their hospitality to Jesus. This hospitality is a lesson to us for our Christian life, that it *must be based on* a loving relationship with the Lord. Then, whatever we do will be a loving response to love received, this is true hospitality.

**Prayer of the Week**

Father, let the gift of your life continue to grow in us, drawing us from death to faith, hope, and love. Keep us alive in Christ Jesus. Keep us watchful in prayer and true to his teaching till your glory is revealed in us. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

**The People of God**

The image of the Church as the people of God has its roots in the Old Testament covenant between God and Israel. In this covenant God wished to sanctify and save not only individuals, but individuals formed into a loving community. The Hebrew Scriptures tell a story of God teaching, preserving, and cherishing his people. This was in preparation for the new people of God formed through the blood of Jesus Christ. The new covenant calls all people to unity in the Holy Spirit. • The Greek word for people is *laos*, from which we get the word *laity*. This image emphasizes the dignity of each individual Christian as a child of God, who has been called into a fellowship of life, love, and truth through faith and baptism. The Lord Jesus invites the members to continue his work of redemption in the world, to be light of the world and salt of the earth. To be vital and active members of the Church means we must help bring others to the Lord both by example and direct effort. We must love as the Lord loves. • The people of God are those who are baptized and acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord and Savior. Thus, we share in the Lord's priestly, prophetic, and royal office. Our mission is to live our lives so the Lord's light shines forth in the world through us. When we love, God's love can be seen. When we act like Christ, we are like salt. Just as the presence of salt in food enhances its flavor and brings out the best taste, so the presence of God's people should bring to the world the exciting news that Jesus is the Savior and that God's kingdom has been established in our midst.

The Diocese has received multiple reports from parishioners of several parishes about receiving scam emails from an imposter who creates an email address using the pastor's name and then sends a phony email asking for money in the form of gift cards. The scam has recently evolved and parishioners are now also receiving text messages from the imposter/scammer using the pastor's name and a local telephone number. **Annual Missionary Appeal**

The Missionary Cooperative Appeal is an annual program in which missionaries from around the world speak at each parish in the diocese. The goal of this appeal is to increase awareness of missionary work and to raise funds to help missionary organizations continue their evangelization efforts. In the Diocese of Sacramento, 50 different missions were selected this year to each speak at two parishes. Last year through generous donations, we collected \$420,110 for 50 missions. • Next weekend, our parish will be visited by Fr. Emeka Okwuosa with the Society of Divine Vocations. Father Okwuosa will share with us his religious community's special ministry of fostering and nurturing vocations to the priesthood and religious life for the Universal Church. The Society of Divine Vocations carries out their ministry in parishes, schools, and missions in 18 countries including Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Ecuador, India, Indonesia, Madagascar, Nigeria, Vietnam, Philippines, Australia, and the United States. • Special envelopes are available in the church vestibule. *Please note that checks should be made payable to Sacred Heart Church.* All funds collected throughout the Diocese will be divided equally among the 50 missionary organizations visiting the Diocese this year. • Thank you in advance for your generosity.
