Cell-Fies—The fifth-grade students have been learning all about plant and animal cells in science class. 

Soccer—Our AGS Soccer Teams continue to play, develop and compete in the Co-Ed Diocesan Soccer League. Our youngest group of kindergarteners completed their season on Sunday, Oct 24 in the first-ever Kindergarten-Cup at Upper Burkett with the newly formed Guardian Angel. It was a great success and a great way to close out the season! Our elementary school teams (grade 1-4) closed out their regular-season last weekend, and will compete Saturday, Oct 30 in the season-ending Diocesan Developmental Tournament at NO OFFSEASON SPORTS in Russellton PA. AGS will field 8 developmental teams this year, the most in recent history!



The AGS JV and Varsity teams have both completed their regular season in the Diocesan Premier League, the top Diocesan Division. JV closed out the season with an exciting back and forth game against Ave Maria, but came up short in a 4-3 loss and will need some help to make the playoffs.
