

Gospel Reflection

This Sunday, Jesus reminds us that "the harvest is abundant but the laborers are few." As Catholic disciples, we are the laborers that the Master is sending. All around us are opportunities to share the love and mercy of Jesus Christ - our homes, our workplaces, our neighborhoods, even our faith communities! Lest we feel unequipped for the task, Jesus gives us some advice.

"Carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals." We might not have a theology degree or training in public speaking, but that doesn't mean we can't share the Gospel. The power of God is at work in simplicity. The disciples went forth with nothing as a reminder to trust in the Providence of God. Say a little prayer that God will speak through you and has a

need for your gifts, just as you are.

"Do not move about from one house to another." So much of the life of Jesus was about relationships. He modeled this attitude by journeying with his disciples. Here he makes the same recommendation to them, to remain with the same family for their entire stay in the town. Break bread with others. Invite them to coffee or a game night in your home. Sharing your faith isn't just about saying the right thing, but loving well over time.

"The dust of your town that clings to our feet, even that we shake off." Sometimes we want to help someone, but for whatever reason, they don't receive it well. Sometimes people aren't interested in our efforts to invite them deeper into faith. When rejection happens, don't carry it with you. Don't let it over-burden your heart. Rejoice that you share in the mission of Christ, and keep on loving the next person he places in your path!

Jesus tells his disciples, "I am sending you like lambs among wolves." Getting people to see the truth about who they are is not always easy or welcomed. Some people want to believe that they have life under control and they do not need any further advice, direction, or challenge from others. Being heralds of the Gospel means doing precisely that. We come with a message that is not always welcome or desired by our sisters and brothers. Yet, it is desperately needed. People need to be reminded of who they are, who God is, and the necessity of repentance for entering the Kingdom of God. It is not about what we want but what God wants. We are called to be peacemakers and laborers for justice and mercy. Are you willing to bring this challenging message to those who may be indifferent or even hostile to hearing it?



SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Expectant parents are encouraged to contact the Parish Office to schedule an appointment to attend the required Baptism Class. Parents must be registered parishioners and should be attending Mass regularly. Baptisms are performed on Sundays during the 11am Mass.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Cari Anne will help with the initial stages of fulfilling the Church's requirements for a Christian Marriage.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK

REFLECTIONS ON STEWARDSHIP

From Saint Teresa of Calcutta: One night a man came to our house to tell me that a Hindu family of eight children had not eaten anything for days. They had no food. I took enough rice for a meal and went to their



house. I could see the hungry faces, the children with their bulging eyes. The sight was very dramatic! The mother took the rice from my hands, divided it in half, and left. When she returned a little later, I asked, "Where did you go? What did you do?"

She answered, "They are also hungry next door." Next door lived a Muslim family of the same size and with no food. The mother had the courage and love to share her meager portion with others. I think she felt very happy to share with her neighbors the little that I had taken her. The theme of **stewardship** is always part of Jesus' teaching.

BeFriender Ministry & Jeannie Johnson

The BeFriender Ministry is a lay pastoral care program. It is more a "being" than a "doing" ministry. Specially trained lay persons who have also had background checks enter into caring relationships with others, at times of special need. They visit and be with those who need emotional or spiritual support. BeFrienders are trained to accept people as they are without telling them how they ought to be; to listen with compassion without offering advice; and to allow others to make their own decisions without trying to decide for them. They are there to listen, and be a sounding board, not to solve problems or suggest solutions.

The frequency and duration of the BeFriender relationship is a mutual agreement between the BeFriender and BeFriendee. Visits are generally made on a weekly basis for one hour. As a ministry, the BeFrienders meet once monthly in our Learning Center for formation, role playing possible scenarios, and to voice any issues that may have arisen. All visits and meetings are strictly confidential. Currently this ministry is providing a listening presence to seven people in Flagler County. 

Have you ever wanted to change the world? Fifth century Europe was a dark place. The Roman Empire had fallen, and barbarian tribes were picking over the scraps of what remained. Faith hung on, but there was no consistent, coherent Christian culture in the world around. Young Benedict began his life with education and privilege but became disillusioned by a life pursuing material success. He withdrew to a monastery and spent much time in solitude. He began attracting followers, whom he organized over time into 12 monasteries, with a 13th established to train young monks. He wrote a rule of life including basic principles for living as Christ. His monks took three vows: conversion to Christ, obedience to the local abbot, and stability to remain with the community. Benedictine monasteries became lights in the darkness, secure centers of Christian culture enlivening the faithful beyond their walls. When the world around us seems complicated and contrary to the Gospel, how will you be a light?

Again, we thank you for your generosity and support in our ministry of giving service and care for your neighbors in need in our community. We do not ask you to make sacrifices for us, but rather to pray and give what you feel is right. Again, thank you for your outpouring of support.




