



Gospel Reflection

This Sunday's Gospel contrasts two different religious attitudes. First, the self-righteous Pharisee. Here is a man who seems to impeccably follow the law. In some terms, he is the model citizen! Honest, fiscally generous, and faithful to his marriage vows. But something else lurks in his heart: pride. "O God, I thank you that I am not like the rest of humanity ... or even like this tax collector." For the Pharisee, no fault can be admitted. The only way to stay on top is to preserve one's image — even to God, it seems! — and point out the flaws of others from the pedestal.

In the back of the temple, hidden and bowed down, is the tax collector. "O God, be merciful to me a sinner." This man's prayer is one of supplication and petition. He isn't afraid to express his sinfulness and misery. This, Jesus says, is the one who "went home justified."

How many times have we heard the mission of Jesus to seek and save the lost? Jesus is the one who dines with sinners and invites every heart to repentance. But how can we return to him if we don't know we've left? How can we receive God's grace when we're adamant we don't need it?

We all have within us both the Pharisee and the tax collector. We want to be sure of ourselves and to be admired in the eyes of others. Yet we also know that we are not always what we wish to present to others. We can be preoccupied with our self-image and feel anxious about our flaws being exposed. Because we do have flaws, after all. We are the sinner in need of mercy. This Sunday, will we humble ourselves enough to ask for it?



SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Expectant parents are encouraged to contact the Parish Office to schedule an appointment to attend the required Baptism Class. Parents must be registered parishioners and should be attending Mass regularly. Baptisms are performed on Sundays after the 11am Mass.

The Parish Office will help with the initial stages of fulfilling the Church's requirements for a Christian Marriage.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK

For those who are in need of the Lord's sacramental touch and blessing in times of sickness. This sacrament is intended for those who are ill or infirm. Please contact the Parish Office to schedule an appointment to celebrate the healing rites of the Church with you and your loved ones.

HOLY ORDERS

Men and women who wish to find out more about Religious Life should contact the Parish Office and speak with the Pastor for more information.

SACRAMENT OF FIRST HOLY COMMUNION

This sacrament is normally celebrated in the Second Grade (7-years-old). Children must be registered in the Faith Formation Program and families must be registered parishioners. For more information, please contact Denise Collins, denise@smdmcc.org or the Parish Office.

SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION

This sacrament is normally celebrated in the Eighth Grade. Candidates must be Baptized, have already received sacraments of Eucharist and Reconciliation and must be enrolled in the Faith Formation Program. Families must be registered parishioners. 

FRANK CRISOLOGO

A man more than willing to help!

Frank Crisologo is a man who goes with the flow, is reliable, trustworthy, and polite, and calmly deals with each situation that comes his way.

He was raised in a Catholic home in Bound Brook, New Jersey. His father was a “jack-of-all-trades” and his mother took care of the family.

He had three siblings (two sisters, one brother—all deceased). He attended public school and received his faith formation at St. Joseph’s Parish.

Frank spent two years in the military and was married to the love of his life, Bernice (Bern) for 58 years. They lived and raised their two children in Bridgewater, New Jersey. Bernice and Frank felt that it was important for Bernice to be a stay-at-home-mother. She was a wonderful cook, homemaker and mother. Family was of primary importance in their lives.

Driving an 18-wheeler truck was one of his occupations. Long-haul driving was just a way of life for Frank. But his real aptitude and talent has always been his ability to work with wood as a carpenter or with any type of construction.

As he got older, Frank learned and mastered the art of creating plastic canvass objects. He



makes houses, bookmarks, Christmas decorations, etc. He was told that men couldn’t handle that kind of work, but he proved them wrong. Plastic canvass is just another way of constructing but on a smaller scale.

Bernice and Frank visited his sister here in Palm Coast in August 1991 and liked it so much that he retired and moved here in September 1991.

Of course, Frank not only totally built his own house but also built his brother’s (he also built his home in Bridgewater and his brother’s home in Seaside Heights, New Jersey). Being a perfectionist, he wanted

first-class workmanship in all his homes.

Frank enjoys watching baseball games on TV (the Mets), along with a few other programs when time permits.

Something you might not know about Frank is that he speaks fluent Spanish—his family originated from Spain.

He’s very involved with the parish Knights of Columbus and was Grand Knight for 2002-03. With the Knights he participates with meals, bingo and other fun and fundraising events.




