Every life is made in the image and likeness of God with intrinsic value, despite the stage of development or social condition. This ministry promotes the dignity of all life from conception to natural death. The expanded scope of populations and focuses includes: the unborn/abortion, healing after abortion, special needs, end of life issues, the death penalty, human trafficking, and samesex attraction support groups.

Unborn/Abortion

Due to the urgency of the threat against unborn life through abortion, efforts in all parishes pay special attention to the unborn focus. Educational programs such as spiritual adoption, ministry fairs, guest speakers, the cross project, life chains, developmental posters, baby bottle campaign, and baby showers all serve to raise awareness. The Pro-Life educational program and contest "Respecting Life Begins With Me" is available in every parish. Parishes are urged to join prayer vigils at abortion facilities and participate in events such as Adopt A Day and the Florida March for Life in Tallahassee.

Healing After Abortion

Since 1973 over 64 million abortions have occurred in our country. The aftermath of abortion can bring about excruciating emotional and spiritual pain that many suffer in silence. The Diocese offers the availability of several programs:

• **Support After Abortion** – Provides one-onone, small group and online resources.

Healing After Abortion (continued)

 Rachel's Vineyard – Retreat weekends bring healing through licensed counselors, clergy and volunteers who have suffered the same loss.

Red Bird Ministry

This grief support ministry guides families in finding healing and restoration after the loss of a child including: miscarriage, stillbirth, and after birth as an infant, child, adolescent, and adult child.

Special Needs

Pre-natal diagnosis of special needs creates a very vulnerable population. Unfortunately, medical counsel given in these instances often are to refer for abortion. Family support and education can be found through assistance and involvement with programs for special needs such as Camp I Am Special, Morning Star School, L'Arche and ARC as well as Be Not Afraid Peer Ministry Pastoral Care.

End of Life

The questions surrounding medical care, how to, and who should, care for lives incapacitated through accident or illness are increasingly a concern for individuals and families. How to create or comply with someone's wishes is the focus of a diocesan educational workshop called "A Question of Compassion" available to all parishes.

Death Penalty/Prison Ministry

Following a consistent ethic of life principal, the Church has changed her stance on the death penalty. Due to available incarceration, the need for the death penalty no longer exists to protect society. The diocese has an active prison ministry and is involved daily in cell front ministry to death

row inmates. Following the international movement to end the death penalty the diocese hosts three sites for Cities for Life on November 30th every year. Collections of toiletries throughout the diocese help to provide more humane treatment. The extension of Project Rachel for post-abortion healing is also offered to inmates.

In addition, Bishop-Emeritus Felipe Estévez published "A Pastoral Letter on Capital Punishment in Florida" in April 2020.

Human Trafficking

Exploitation of another human being for sexual, domestic, or work in agricultural settings is present day human slavery. This office offers workshops on human trafficking to educate, and networks with other agencies to advocate for victims.

Same-Sex Attraction

Courage and Encourage offers monthly support groups for individuals experiencing same-sex attraction and for their families.

General Information

Unplanned pregnancy and post-abortion healing assistance is advertised in the parish bulletin. The Office of Human Life & Dignity Speakers Bureau is available for all topics.
