REFLECTING ON

SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

WE HAVE THE POWER OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

May 29, 2022 • Seventh Sunday of Easter

Acts 1:1-11; Psalm 47: 2-3, 6-9; Eph 1:17-23; Lk 24:46-53

On this Feast of the Ascension, we celebrate Christ's triumphant return to the Father after perfectly accomplishing His mission on earth. But we also can also view this Feast as a celebration of the "launch day" of our commissioning as Christ's disciples.

Both the First Reading and today's Gospel draw our attention to the clear instructions that Jesus gave His disciples just before ascending to the Father. In the First Reading, from Acts, He tells them (and us) "you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." Then in the Gospel, from Luke, we read, "Jesus said to his disciples: "Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things."

Embracing a stewardship way of life, with its emphasis on the use of time, talent, and treasure, helps us to live in such a way that our very lives speak as a witness of the Good News of the Gospel. In the use of Time, we can ask ourselves if we are keeping the particular prayer commitments we have made. If so, have I noticed a deepened closeness to our Lord and an increase in virtue in my daily life? Perhaps I have let one or two of my "holy habits" go by the wayside. Then simply re-commit to them. Or maybe my prayer commitments have become routine and I could carry them out more intentionally once again. Maybe my schedule has changed and I need to establish a new time to pray.

In the use of Talent, have I stayed faithful to the ministry commitments I made? How is my attitude towards serving? Am I joyful and humble about the work I am doing? How has my serving of others changed and blessed me? Finally, let's take a look at our use of Treasure. Have I been generous in my financial giving? If so, have I noticed a deepening trust in God's care for me? Have I become a little more detached from the pull of materialism that surrounds us all in this day and age?

A stewardship way of life is challenging because it is counter-cultural to put God and others before ourselves. But that is precisely why this way of life is such a powerful witness to the message of the Gospel. And we can embrace this way of life with great confidence and joy because we are not expected to do this on our own. Our Gospel passage today tells us we are "clothed with power from on high." Whether it is as small a detail as finding a new prayer time, or as big as changing career paths to be more available to loved ones, we have the power of the Holy Spirit to show us the way. On this Feast of the Ascension, take the time to celebrate your victories as Christ's disciples and renew your commitment to remain faithful to Him and the unique mission He has entrusted to you!

Dear Cathedral Family,

It is with a heavy heart that I begin my letter to you after reading and hearing the tragic news of the shooting in Uvalde Texas. Such an enormous tragedy of unspeakable pain and sadness at the destruction of innocent children's lives and the teachers who tried to protect them. May the merciful love of God triumph in the darkness and bring healing, hope and peace that the world cannot give.

This weekend we are celebrating the Ascension of Our Lord---the moment when Jesus, after spending 40 days in His resurrected state---returns to the Father while the angels shouted for joy! He returns to the Father completing His earthly mission----and before He leaves---He commissions the first apostles---and now us---to keep doing what He came to do—namely to go into the whole world and make disciples of all the nations! The Church is born with a "missionary" mandate.

Do you realize you have a mission? It is very important and very personal. Only you will know what it is. Are you praying to fulfill it? We cannot without supernatural help---which we know are the Sacraments of the Church—the very life of God given to us for the sake of salvation. The journey begins at baptism---when original sin is washed away and the Father Son and Holy Spirit come to dwell in our soul. This "indwelling" is the basis for our holiness—and our call to become "more" every day in Him.

We celebrated the Sacrament of Confirmation for ninety-eight of our 8th graders this past Friday night and Saturday morning. You remember that the Rite of Confirmation completes or "seals" the gifts we received in baptism and the life of the Holy Spirit intensifies within us to prepare us for "mission" as a witnesses to Christ--- and a missionary for God's love in the world. We must pray for the young newly confirmed that they will come to a deeper knowledge and love of God through the outpouring of the Holy Spirit in their lives. Of course Sacraments are not magic. We have only to look to see how many people receive Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Eucharist, yet never claim the gifts; essentially living like anyone else who has never received a Sacrament.

This is why faith is so critical. Faith is a gift and we can only pray for it, receive and be thankful for it. We can make "acts of faith," by telling God we believe in Him and telling others we believe in Him. (By the way, that is why we say the Creed at every mass). We need living faith---which keeps us in contact with the living God. Praying for our young people is what will help them the most right now. They need to see and encounter a community of disciples that are fully alive in Christ. This is why we need to prepare for Pentecost this coming Sunday.

I encourage you to come to the Great Pentecost Vigil next Saturday night---Bishop Checchio will celebrate and then---we will keep Vigil---with prayer---songs and inspirational talks---along with priests hearing confessions---until midnight. I encourage you to pray this prayer everyday with living faith—cut it out and paste it on your mirror or refrigerator—or someplace you will not forget to say it---but say it by putting your heart in it---we need to be baptized in the Holy Spirit--- a living choice to welcome and live by the Spirit in order to be fully alive in our Christian life.

O Holy Spirit, Divine Consoler! I adore You as my Triune God.

I bless You by uniting myself to the praises You receive from the angels and saints.

I offer You my whole heart, and I render You heartfelt thanks for the gifts You have bestowed on me, and unceasingly on the whole world.

You are the author of all supernatural gifts—and who did enrich with immense favors upon the soul of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God.

I renounce all my sins and attachment to evil and choose to accept the Lordship of Jesus Christ in every aspect of my life---Baptize me in your bath of graces so I may sing God's praises now, and for all eternity.

Have a blessed week---You are the apple of God's eye! He loves you so much---so live like a son or daughter of God. Father Christy




