THE MUSIC AT MASS

Since the early days of the Christian Church, the psalms have played a significant role in worship. As the Mass began to take shape in the early centuries as a recreation and

combination of The Last Supper and Christ's sacrifice at Golgotha, psalm singing (and the singing of other texts from Scripture) became ever more important. As the texts of the New Testament became a part of Mass, specific psalms gradually became attached to certain Masses because of their direct link with either prophetic Old Testament Scripture, or New Testament writings.

Eventually, these sung pieces came to be known as the **Propers** and the **Ordinary** of the Mass (terms we still use today), codified by Pope Saint Gregory I, after whom Gregorian chant is named. Gregory, a prolific writer, brought together the various regions of the Church (geographic areas like Antioch, Alexandria, Rome, etc., which were starting to grow further apart in liturgical styles) and united them by organizing the chants of the Mass into a specific order. He published them and sent them to be used by the various Churches that followed the Roman Rite of the Mass. Next week: the **Ordinary** of the Mass vs. the **Propers**!
