Cathedral Family,

This coming week we will observe Ash Wednesday and with it enter into the life changing season of Holy Lent. The longer I live the more important I have discovered, this Spring time season of the Church year truly is. It marks the hope of the Christian life. Namely, at the heart of the message of Lent is that we can change. We don't have to remain stuck in bad habits, compromises and sin. In fact, Christ came precisely to liberate us from the "bonds of death," which is more than the moment of our earthly death, but includes the daily turning away from sin and living for the gospel. We are heading toward life, or heading toward death---depending on how we live each day.

As I write this letter to you, I am pondering my own call to conversion. "What should I do for Lent?" In my prayer this morning it occurred to me that God was asking me to first of all review my life with Him—a kind of examination of conscience---where am I today with you Lord? Where do you want me to risk more? To trust more? To abandon myself more? These questions are the beginning of what I need to ask myself in helping decide what I will "give up for Lent," "what will I do for Lent." I invite you to do the same. Spend some time these next days asking the Holy Spirit to guide you to first believe and know that God is speaking to you. He wants to connect with your heart. He wants to call you "into the dessert," where He will make you new. And then determine if it is really true that God wants more for my life and I want more for my life---what am I willing to do in order to say yes to that invitation?

Please join us for Ash Wednesday Mass and the distribution of Ashes. This is a day of fast and abstinence---all those over the age of 14 until the age of 59, if in good health are required to abstain from meat and all meat products as well as to fast---to limit the intake of food to one regular meal and two small meals---so as to experience hunger. In this way we learn that we do not live by bread alone---but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.

The Ashes we will have marked on our forehead is a reminder that we must die to ourselves in order to live for Him. We die to our sinful habits and pride. The ashes proclaim that we are sinners in need of God's mercy. In the early Church those who wore "Ashes" were telling the community they need the prayers and help of others in order to be faithful to their commitment to Christ. May we see our Ash Wednesday, and all of Lent, as our journey in solidarity with each other to Gods' Kingdom. We need one another for challenge, comfort and comradery on the journey of life. Christianity is a team sport.

Please know of my prayers for all of you every day. And please pray for me and the parish for deep renewal this Lent.

Lenten Obligation

So that the Church of Metuchen may be spiritually one in a common observance of Lent, the following days of fast and abstinence are to be observed by all Catholics of the Diocese who enjoy blessings of good health.

- 1. The days of fast and abstinence are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- 2. All other Fridays of Lent are day of abstinence. (See note below with regards to March 17th)
- 3. The obligation of fast applies only to Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59.

 Fasting in the Catholic tradition means to limit oneself to one full meal and two smaller meals which together are not equal to a full meal, so as to experience hunger.
- 4. The obligation of abstinence applies to all Catholics who have reached the age of 14. *Abstinence in the Catholic tradition means to abstain from meat.*

*Note: This year the Memorial of St. Patrick falls on a Friday. For members of the faithful celebrating this Memorial and who desire it, Bishop Checchio has commuted the penitential obligation on March 17th to the obligation to abstain from meat on another day that same week.

The obligation of fast and abstinence, as a whole, is a serious obligation. While failure to observe any penitential day in itself may not be considered serious, the failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of them without good cause, would be considered serious. Those unable to abstain for a valid reason on any given Friday of Lent are asked to perform some other penitential act, or to abstain on another day.





THE MUSIC AT MASS

There's quite a bit of music involved at Mass, everything ranging from the Propers and Ordinary, to the Psalms and Litanies, to the Angelic Hymns (Gloria and Sanctus, both part of the Ordinary), etc. However, the most important music that is sung at Mass is the *dialogues*. The dialogues are the brief conversations that happen between the priest or deacon and the congregation throughout the Mass. The shortest of these is the greeting: (Priest) *The Lord be with you*, (Cong.) *And with your spirit*. When we are addressed with the words. "The Lord be with you," the priest (or deacon) "is



expressing his desire that the dynamic activity of God's spirit be given to the people of God, enabling them to do the work of transforming the world that God has entrusted to them." (USCCB.org/) When we respond with, "And with your spirit," we are specifically addressing the gift of the spirit of ordination that the priest (or deacon) received and now exists within the man himself. This is why this response is only ever used for one who has been ordained. A slightly longer dialogue is the Preface Dialogue (The Lord be with you\ and with your spirit\Lift up your hearts\We lift them up to the Lord,\Let us give thanks/It is right and just.) The primary reason for the dialogues being the most important music at Mass is that it is the easiest way for the congregation to actively and consciously participate externally in song. Along with internal participation, external participation unites us with each other at Mass, and outwardly demonstrates our shared faith in Christ and his Church.
