Eucharistic Adoration: Eucharistic Adoration is held every Tuesday evening after the 7:00 pm Mass until 9:00 in the chapel. Eucharistic Adoration for Respect Life Intentions is held every Fridays from 8:30 - 9:30 am in the Church.

Sacrament of Baptism: Baptisms are held on the Fourth Sunday of each month at 12:30 pm or during a Sunday Mass. Attendance at a pre-baptismal class is required. Arrangements may be made by contacting the parish office.

Sacrament of the Sick: Arrangements can be made anytime for the administration of the Sacrament of the Sick. Please call the parish office when someone is looking to receive the Sacrament of the Sick.

Marriage Arrangements: Arrangements for marriage must be made at least one year in advance of the wedding. Engaged couples must comply with all marriage preparation programs that are required by NJ Bishops. Please call to make an appointment with the parish priest to begin marriage preparation.

Religious Education Classes: The Religious Education program at St. Cecilia parish is committed to faith formation and formal training of children. The goal is to inspire and motivate children to develop love of the Father, have a personal encounter with Jesus Christ with guidance and knowledge of the Holy Spirit. We will build an understanding of the basic beliefs in the Roman Catholic faith and lay the foundation and encouragement to carry those beliefs to the community.

The preparation for the sacrament of Confirmation is incorporated over a period of three years for grades 6-7-8. Parish service hours are a sacramental requirement.

Sponsors & Godparents: The following are the mandated requirements to be a sponsor/Godparent at St. Cecilia parish:

- ▼ If married, the marriage MUST be valid within the Catholic Church
- ★ At least 14 years of age
- * Received the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation in the Catholic Church
- ★ Attend Mass regularly on Sundays (or Saturday evening) and Holy Days of obligation
- ♣ Receive the Sacrament of the Church regularly

Sponsors and Godparents must be an active parishioner and be attending Mass for at least 3 months to be eligible.

Parish Membership

Any new family who has moved into the parish area, and adult children 18 years of age and older, are invited to register as parishioners. The definition of an active parishioner is: One registered, attending Mass weekly and contributing to the support of the church.

From Scripture:

Luke 6:27-38; Being merciful as God is merciful



In this Gospel passage, Jesus tells us to "love your enemies...lend and expect nothing back...and forgive." All of these go against our human ideas of fairness. In the Old Testament, the "eye for an eye" rule was meant to make sure the punishment wasn't excessive. Likewise, the idea of getting favors was meant to

show gratitude for a favor already given.

The problem is that "an eye for an eye" can result in a vicious cycle of violence and destroyed relationships. The "favor for favor" idea reduces the value of giving gifts out of kindness and appreciation to simply owing favors. How would you know if the good someone did you was because he or she loved you or because they wanted something from you?

Jesus "updates" the old understanding of justice to God's justice, which is infinitely wiser and more perfect. God doesn't dole out his love to the most deserving, but freely to everyone. His goodness includes mercy as well as justice. His love is generous, selfless, simple, and compassionate. The surest sign of being God's children is if we love others the way he does.

Cornerstone is a 26-hour experience which provides you with the opportunity to reflect renew and strengthen your faith while meeting other men in our Christian community. The weekend is hosted at our parish center by parishioners who have experienced the gift of past Cornerstone weekends.

The Cornerstone Story

The idea of Cornerstone is simple, but its impact has been profound. Since the inception of this weekend over 10 years ago, more than 200 men have attended Cornerstone at Saint Augustine's alone. In addition, hundreds more have enjoyed the experience at more than fifty parishes that also offered Cornerstone.

Who Comes to Cornerstone?

- Anyone looking to "jump-start" their sense of belonging in the parish community.
- Those looking to take time out for themselves and reflect.
- Men who have been away from the Church for a while and are curious about re-connecting.
- Those looking to meet and interact with other men in our Christian community.

What You Can Expect

There is no mystery to the Men's Cornerstone weekend. It's simply a Gathering of Ordinary Men sharing stories and life's experiences.

The weekend is facilitated by a team who are passing along the gift of Cornerstone which they have previously experienced. During the weekend in a very casual atmosphere, some of these men will give a short talk followed by discussion at your table.
