

these people at every Mass I celebrate.


Holy Mass in Remembrance - This Thursday 6:30 pm

The Vocation of Marriage — The Birthplace of all Vocations

This week, we celebrate National Vocations week. While the Vocations we most often talk about are Priesthood and the Consecrated Life, none of these are possible without the beautiful Vocation of Marriage, a Vocation where God calls many and would not want us to ignore! So this week, we asked our St. Elizabeth parish staff to give their own testimonies to the Vocation of Marriage.

"My marriage has been a blessing in my life, I would not have imagined it any other way. Without it, I would be missing the best part of myself, my husband. Even though when I got married I was career oriented and that influenced me so much in my life decisions. I never imagined not being married. It is wonderful to have the companionship, patience and support of someone that I know will always be there for me in when I am in a good place and also at my worst. Without my marriage I would not have had my wonderful sons something else I can't imagine my life without. They bring so much to my life and make me a better person. My best piece of advice is not to sweat the small stuff. Sometimes it is easy to get wrapped up in the little petty things, but really, in the end it is not worth it." ~ Kim Conte

"I grew up never having to doubt that I was loved as my parents marriage taught me the beauty of love and sacrifice through their marriage. They encouraged their kids to have a life of Faith and were not afraid to share their Faith with us. As I discerned my Vocation, I was never afraid to tell my mom and dad that I was discerning Consecrated Life. I knew as long as I desired to do the will of God they would support me no matter what." ~ Trisha Trout

"My "call" to Priesthood began in four simple seeds being planted by my Dad and Mom and their Marriage. Seed 1: My

Dad and Mom did not care if I was Married or became a Priest or Religious, rather they stressed the need to LISTEN to GOD and follow His

Seed 2: My Dad and Mom had Priests and Religious over to the house just for short visits

Seed 3: When I mentioned the idea of becoming a Priest they were supportive (not pushy).

Seed 4: My Mom and Dad were involved in the Parish. We never missed Sunday Mass and had regular Confession. I remember my Dad as Lector at Sunday Mass." ~ Fr. Dave

My marriage is a little different than most in the sense that I am married to a non-Catholic, non-Baptized man. So how do we make it work? First, we came into this marriage with enough love for each other to know this was a life time commitment. We wanted children and never would we ever separate ourselves from them by even thinking about divorce. Second, we respect each other enough to acknowledge that we have two different beliefs. My husband knew before we were married that I, if not we. would raise our children in the Catholic Faith and he supported me completely. Third, we forgive each other when we make mistakes. Forgiveness is key in all relationships because we are not yet perfect. Marriage is so much like God's love for us. God's love for us is eternal, He respects our choices by giving us free will and forgives us when we fail. ~ Sue Ogg

"Marriage is an adventure of a lifetime. Many times the adventure is absolutely wonderful, like when a couple is blessed to experience the fruits of their marriage in children being born, being baptized, receiving their first communion, graduating, being responsible members of society, helping those who are less fortunate, living their faith, being in loving relationships of their own...and the best fruit of all receiving GRANDCHILDREN! Other times the adventure gets difficult, really difficult sometimes: like when someone gets cancer or when you disagree about money or exactly what the best way is to raise your children because you were raised



differently. But what I have learned is if you can "tough out" these difficult times and rely on God's grace, He will bless you and make your marriage stronger as a result of going through it. It may not feel like a blessing at the time, but you will definitely see it when you look back on the great adventure that you began together on the day you said "I do."





IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY 2020

What is the requested offering? St. Elizabeth Ann Seton parish requests a yearly offering of \$60.00 for each Mass inten-



2020 Mass Intention Guidelines

"The Holy Mass is the most precious Gift one may offer"

1. A Mass can be offered for an intention (peace, special intention, vocations) or for anyone, living or deceased (Catholic or non-Catholic). We are not allowed to schedule a Mass beyond the given year. The Mass stipend is \$10 per Mass Intention set by the bishops of the USCCB (not necessary for those unable). Requests are on a first come availability basis. We will begin

taking Mass intentions for 2020 the first week of December 2019. No Masses for 2020 can be accepted before this time.

- 2. There is a limited availability of Sunday Masses. Specific dates and times for a Sunday Mass may be limited due to availability. There are more Masses available during the week. One need not be present at the Mass you requested.
- 3. Please come to the parish office to schedule your Mass intentions. We want to accommodate your request as best we can; the parish office is open Monday through Thursday 9:00 am-4:30 pm, Friday 9:00 am-Noon.
- **4. Your Mass intention date may be moved.** Even though a Mass may have been scheduled, due to responsibilities of the parish Priest(s) such as meetings, vacation, retreat, or illness, Mass Intentions <u>may be moved to another time</u> during the given year. If a Mass has to be moved, we will make every effort to contact the person requesting Mass to let them know.
- **5. Your Mass intention may be said elsewhere.** If you ask for a large number of Masses (more than 10 per person/intention), or you request a Mass Intention and there are no openings, these Mass Intentions may be sent to the Chancery to be used by retired priests, other parishes or missionary priests. If you have reached your 10 Mass limit and would like to schedule a Mass, you may do so if there are any unscheduled Masses available within two weeks of the date you stop by the office.
- 6. All Holyday Masses including Easter and Christmas Masses are <u>not</u> available. These special days are used by our Priests for their personal intentions.

"The offering of a Holy Mass is a Precious Gift for oneself, a friend, an intention or for the Eternal good of someone who has died. Here at St. Elizabeth's there are more requests for Masses than we have Masses available for a given year. Be patient and charitable! God bless" - Fr. Dave
