Brothers and Sisters,

Pax et Bonum! It is a great joy to pen this article October 4th (the feast of Francis of Assisi) and to tell you about the joyful pilgrimage myself and 28 others traveled these past two weeks (and yes, its very good to be back with you as well-I missed you all).


ROME

Pilgrimage, as I told my fellow travelers, is not a vacation so much as it is a microcosm of Christian existence. We begin a journey with great joy and excitement, experience incredible sights, wonders, joys, pains, conflicts, surprises, and eventually return (please God) richer for the experience to our homeland. Throughout it all, you are drenched in the presence of God, always aware of His helping hand, and looking forward, straining even, toward the next spiritual marker He has laid out for you.


MANOPPELLO

The travel (for those who have taken a transatlantic flight) is long and tiresome (but better than the 8 days by boat), and then upon touching ground, there is no rest, but the journey begins at once-for you will only have twelve days to see what God has placed over the millennia in the beautiful nation of Italy and the eternal city of Rome. What could I tell you of, my brothers and sisters? Should I tell you of our first encounter with the Holy Face at Manoppello? Of visiting the major relics of Padre Pio at his monastery? The Eucharistic miracle of Lanciano? Each has its own personal story, seen through twenty eight different sets of eyes-but I think, for the sake of space (and to honor the patron saint of the day of this writing), I shall mention Assisi.

Almost beyond words is this picturesque town that was the home of great saints, set on a hillside, charming in its attempt to retain its antiquity and overshadowed with basilicas and cathedral, beautiful was the birthplace of little Francis and poor Clare. I could have spent a week exploring it (or just remaining at the Holy sites in prayer and contemplation).


LANCIANO

As I walked through buildings more ancient than nations, and praying at the tombs of the saints, a great memory. My uncle, Father Gregor Holicky (a retired priest of the Gary of Diocese, and my fellow pilgrim on this journey) had visited Assisi numerous times during his seminary years in the 1960's and 70's at the North American College (located in the Vatican). For the first time in his life, he celebrated Mass upon the very tomb of Saint Francis, as his nephew concelebrated beside him. I wept to see my uncle's decades of devotion crowned by such an occasion.

Still another milestone: I must mention that a small family was with us on this pilgrimage-the father had been a Franciscan Friar early in his adulthood before finding his vocation in the married life, and now, with his lovely young wife and eleven month old son, he and they trekked around the sacred soil of Assisi. They all did, for in that holy little town, his little boy took his first steps.


ASSISI

This is the glory of pilgrimage, life crowned with glory at every stage, under the caring eyes of the God-Man. And I urge you all to take one. The sooner the better. Should you fear it will make you poor, consider how enriched Francis was by poverty, and the real homeland to your journey toward is not here, but in eternity.

TRIVIA QUESTION, WHO REMEMBERS BISHOP'S ISLAND?

When the Erie-Michigan Canal was abandoned, a remnant of that 1830's Fort Wayne to Lake Michigan project remained in Rome City. Lake Sylvan was created with the intension of being a source of water for the ill-fated canal. However, our diocese had a relationship after a home was built in 1902 on an island in Sylvan Lake at Rome City which was commissioned by Bishop Alerding. Later Bishop Noll enlarged the home for use as a summer retreat. Each July, the Bishop spent the month there from which he conducted the business of correspondence, articles, and diocesan activities. Noticeably missing was a telephone that Bishop had never installed. Each day visitors to Bishop Island came over and Bishop Noll concelebrated Mass. It was a relaxing spiritual place for meeting with priests, religious orders and lay people alike. Not only did prayer and reflection take place, but also a lot of picnicking, fishing, and boating. In 2008 the Diocese sold Bishop's Island at auction.

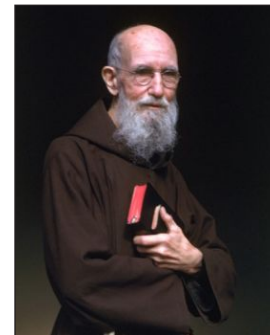
