AS LENT DRAWS CLOSER TO AN END, MAY GOD'S LIGHT GUIDE YOUR DAY

The last stage of Lent is now upon us. With Passiontide present and visible to us in the veiling of the statues in church, we are reminded of the heightened focus on the cross of Jesus that he knowingly enters into and embraces for love of you and me. We begin to pray from a different preface at Mass (prayed after "lift up your hearts / we lift them up to the Lord" and before the Sanctus or "Holy, Holy, Holy") for these last two weeks, to shift the focus from what we are doing to what Jesus is about to do.

We welcome this weekend my friends Alfred and Grace Salsa to offer religious articles from the Holy Land once again. They will also be holding an information session / Q&A on Sunday afternoon at 4:30pm regarding the pilgrimage to the Holy Land that I will be leading next year. If you want to learn more as you consider joining or have specific questions, please come to that. If not possible, you can ask them in person your questions. I'm excited to have them joining me on the pilgrimage next Lent as companions and guides.

Next week is Holy Week. It is also Spring Break for most schools. I know this means a challenge for us all to keep the focus on the Lord during this time, and I simply encourage you to continue to keep your prayer going strong and don't forget to make it more, not less, centered on Jesus. This will take some real planning for those who are going to be out of routine, or even harder, out of town. Please look ahead for how you will attend Mass on Palm Sunday, have special times of prayer, and, as an optional but emphasized recommendation, attend the parish services on Good Friday and Holy Thursday wherever you find yourself. Nothing stresses the importance of our faith more than when we make it a priority when we are travelling or out of routine.

Next Sunday, for Palm Sunday, our Fraternus and Fidelis youth groups are offering a living Stations of the Cross once again. This has been deeply moving and highly appreciated for our parishioners who have attended in years past, so I cannot emphasize enough the offer to attend. Please come and pray with us at 3pm next week if you can. You will be impressed at how well the youth lead us in this prayerful reflection of our Lord's way to Calvary.

May the Lord grant you a blessed final two weeks of Lent!

This week it is a pleasure to welcome Mrs. Jennifer Kleber, 2nd grade teacher extraordinaire, to the Pioneer spotlight! Mrs. Kleber grew up in Martinsville, Virginia, a tiny town in southern Virginia. Knowing early on that she wanted to be a teacher, she used to take her graded worksheets and white out the answers. Then she would make copies on her dad's copy machine and make her sister, who was 5-years younger and couldn't yet read, complete them! She has always loved school supplies and still gets excited when a new school year begins and the school supplies come out! She went to college at St. Mary's College in South Bend, Indiana, where she met her husband, Seb. Mrs. Kleber finished college in 2004. She and Seb were married that same year and moved to Fort Wayne. Her first teaching position was in 5th grade at Saint Vincent de Paul Catholic School. After her first year of teaching, she stayed home for the next 11-years raising her four children, Emma, Sophie, Logan, and Jackson. When daughter Emma was in Mrs. Peter's first grade class here at SEASCS, Mrs. Kleber would

volunteer in the classroom copying, tearing workbook pages, and whatever else was of help. She continued to be a much-appreciated volunteer until a teaching opportunity opened up for a 3rd grade teacher. Deciding that a return to teaching was now best for her family, Mrs. Kleber returned to the classroom in 2016. By this time, daughter Sophie was also in the 3rd grade. Restarting her teaching career with this particular group of students was a blessing! Mrs. Kleber has taught 3rd grade, 4th grade, and has now settled into 2nd grade. She tells us "It has been amazing to come to school with my own children. We started out with all four kids here at SEASCS and now I am down to two. Emma and Sophie have graduated from SEASCS and are now a junior and freshman at Bishop Dwenger High School. I have taught at our school for seven years and have loved every minute of it!" Her favorite part of teaching 2nd grade is when students learn about adoration and the monstrance. A favorite project each year is when the students design and make their own monstrance. They are beautiful, unique, and always take her breath away. She loves developing relationships with each student, celebrating their highs and helping them grow throughout the year. She is always amazed at the amount of growth that takes place from the 1st day of 2nd grade to the last. Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton is Mrs. Kleber's favorite saint. Her favorite "jobs," in life are being a mother and a teacher, both a privilege. She strives to be like Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton every day. When not in the classroom, you can find Mrs. Kleber from May through September in her backyard, in the pool, hanging out with her children. The family loves traveling to the beach every summer, taking long walks, and looking for seashells. She also loves to cross-stitch. Thank you, Mrs. Kleber, for all you do for our 2nd graders especially in preparing them for First Holy Communion.

Our 5th graders recently spent the day at Junior Achievement's BizTown. BizTown combines in-class learning with a day-long visit to a simulated town. In preparation for the trip, students have developed a basic understanding of the free enterprise system, learned the importance of citizen rights and responsibilities, built money management skills, and much more!

The Catholic Home Missions is an organization founded in 1924 by the American Board of Catholic Missions with the aim of helping and supporting poor dioceses in the United States.

WHY 40 DAYS?

Our over 2,000 year old Catholic Church comes to us with fascinating traditions: Christ's 40 days in the desert; Moses' 40 days on Mount Sinai; Elijah's 40 fast days up to Mount Horeb; Israelites' 40 years in the desert; after 40 days Noah opened the hatch of the ark; Jonah's 40 day warning to Nineveh; and how 40 was incorporated eventually to began with Ash Wednesday perhaps for the Angelo-Saxon word for springtime lencten anticipating the gradual lengthening of daylight. As preparation for new life and Easter, early converts to Christianity had to be instructed and reject their pagan ways. It was a process that took years before finalizing during a period of what was to become Lent as a time of intense catechesis and culminating with baptism at Easter Vigil. As such, Holy Thursday's Mass ends the 40 days of Lent, and marks the start of the Triduum. [From the files of Allen County Historian Tom Castaldi.]


