ALL THINGS SACRED

Try to carve out some time for one of the following: June 12th at 7:30pm or June 14th at 6:00pm. As our parish renovation plans have been out for a few weeks and we have had time to examine them, I would like to do a presentation to the parish about sacred architecture and the designs of Catholic churches. The goal is to give the foundation for the changes we are about to make for our parish and how it will be a benefit to our worship. This will also allow for us all to understand and explain our faith better to those that we meet, and thus allow this investment in our house of worship to pay dividends in the souls of those beyond our parish boundaries. It will hopefully clarify any questions you may have in your own hearts regarding why certain decisions were proposed. I am also excited to share the emerging ideas for our new stained glass windows and the sacred art that is proposed for our front area of church. I am not naturally a cheerleader for things, but these ideas have me pretty excited and I think I will be able to come out of my introvert shell a little bit more than normal. It is great to know that some of the skills that were perfected centuries ago are not entirely lost, and it is a great sign of the vitality of our Catholic faith and this culture (albeit wavering) that there is still the ability to produce beautiful and creative artwork.

The Liturgy Project, a start-up group of young Catholics in the area, is sponsoring a special Mass at our parish on June 2nd at 7:30pm. This group is learning more about the Mass, its meaning and history, and the proper celebration of the holy liturgy according to the Church's guidance. As implementers, not reformers, the Liturgy Project is aimed to share this study (both in knowledge of the liturgy and in actually praying the liturgy) with others through coordinating Masses at various parishes in the Fort Wayne area. The goal of the LP Masses is to incorporate traditional elements into the celebration of the Novus Ordo to more clearly show the liturgy's beauty and sacredness and follow more closely Vatican II's hopes for the new form of the Rite. A few changes make for a radically different experience of worship, including the use of Latin and the Ad Dominum ("toward the Lord") direction of the priest during the Eucharistic Prayer. Gregorian Chant and perhaps even polyphonic pieces will be sung during our Votive Mass of the Sacred Heart of Jesus (two weeks prior to the Feast of the Sacred Heart). If you are interested in experiencing the liturgy in a way you perhaps never have before, please try to come and join us that evening.

We have begun our novena for Deacon David Langford's impending ordination to the priesthood by Bishop Rhoades. With great anticipation, we look forward to his first Mass next weekend at the 9:45am Mass and a celebration to follow. I am so glad he desired to share his first Mass with the parish in this way, knowing that it will be an inspiration to the young men and women here to remain open to a life-long consecration of their life to the Lord in the priesthood or as a religious brother or sister. May the Lord bless him and the other future-priests with all the grace they need to serve faithfully with the heart of Christ Jesus.

Finally, please plan to join for a farewell celebration for Fathers Stephen and Luke on Saturday June 17th after the Mass. It will be a great opportunity for us to show appreciation for their priestly ministry and to wish them well as they move forward to their new assignments, taking charge of two parish communities of their own. May God's grace prepare their paths before them! St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, pray for us!

During the first quarter of this year, through your gifts, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul



MATRIMONY

Engaged couples wishing to marry at St. Elizabeth should contact Raeann Mullen at 432-0268, before reserving a wedding date. Weddings typically take place at the Catholic parish where the bride or groom has been registered for some time and are attending Mass regularly. Marriage preparation classes take about six months to complete, and it is never too early to begin the preparation program.



1. How long have you been a parishioner at St. Elizabeth?

A. Since I was baptized here as a baby in 1997! Although I only officially registered after I entered seminary.

2. What is your favorite memory about the parish?

A. Receiving my first communion in second grade.

3. What is your favorite memory about the school?

A. Starring in the school play "Angel Alert" in 5th grade – I was Gabriel (one of the leading roles), and I had a lot of fun!

4. Who will be doing the homily at your first Mass on June 4 at 9:45 am? Why did you select this person?

A. Fr. Joe Moriarty, the rector of where I spent my first part of seminary, Bishop Simon Brute College Seminary in Indianapolis. He was a tremendous example to me of priestly fatherhood, a holy man, and a phenomenal preacher. More simply, he is a priest I want to be like.

5. What are you most looking forward to about being a priest?

A. Giving people Jesus, most especially in offering them the sacraments.

6. Who will be vesting you and why?

A. Fr. Drew Curry. He was the associate pastor here growing up, and he was so happy to be a priest. I saw him and thought, I really do want to be a priest. And here I am all those years later!

7. When did you first have an inclination to discern the priesthood?

A. As a young child, I think even before kindergarten.

8. Aside from your parents, who are one or two people who were most influential in leading you to discern holy orders?

A. Two family members were a big help – my uncle was a priest in the Missionaries of Charity Fathers, and his example was a big inspiration to me. Also my older sister, now a Dominican Nun in New Jersey, who with me growing up was discerning her vocation as well. It helps to have company and inspiration on the journey!

9. Describe your relationship with Jesus.

A. It's hard to describe something so personal and intimate. The Apostles described Him to each other as "The Lord", as John said to Peter in John 21, and they immediately ran after Him. I try to do the same – to recognize Jesus in my life and make my life as constant running towards Him. Concretely this means daily prayer, spiritual reading, and committing my life to Him as a celibate priest.

10. What saint has most influenced you in your formation?

A. A lot of saints have played a role. Perhaps St. John Henry Newman, who I think is the greatest theologian the Church has seen since St. Thomas Aquinas – but who even more importantly was a great saint, whose life resembled that of Christ. It is said that he was the most attractive personality of his age, and through him thousands became Catholic. I would highly recommend everything he ever wrote, both as Anglican and as a Catholic – especially his Apologia pro Vita Sua and his collections of sermons.

11. What do you do to relax?

A. I like to read, especially fiction and biographies. I enjoy hiking, biking, and swimming. I love to visit parks and spend time in nature – especially the snow. I enjoy time with my family (I have 5 siblings!)

12. What is something that we don't know about you?

A. In high school I participated in a robotics club and won awards at the National Robotics Competition for entries in robot sumo and autonomous maze-following.


