We have reached the midway point of ordinary time. So, what is the point of ordinary time? Is it just a filler between the more solemn seasons of the Church, or is it something more?

For the past few weeks, Jesus in the gospel is teaching about the mysteries of God, heaven, and earth. He is proclaiming the good news, so that hearts may return to him and deepen their relationship with Him. Essentially, ordinary time is a time of growth and maturation, the time when the mystery of Christ is to penetrate more in our lives.

Honestly, this time changes our interaction with the Church, so that our participation in the solemn seasons of the Church (Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter) is different. The mysteries of Christ are ever-ancient and ever-new. What he offers has not changed, but what we can receive from Him does change.

We are in a process of conversion until the moment we pass from this world. Do we see the solemn seasons through the same lens every year? Do we do the same practices every year? If so, that should be the sign that our growth has become stagnant. When plants stop growing the next immediate stage would be to wilt and begin to fade away. We cannot allow the mysteries of Christ to become stagnant in us, or worse begin to fade away.

This is a time to allow the mysteries of Christ to penetrate our lives making each solemn season a new dynamic revelation of Christ's life. This mystery of blessed communion with God and all who are in Christ is beyond all understanding and description — thus, we can never have it "all figured out." Scripture speaks of it in images: Sower and the seed, the wheat and the weeds, the leaven of the dough, the pearl of great price, and so on. From these images, there is always a startling part of the parable that should attract our attention; something that requires more pondering and even leads us to search for a greater understanding from greater theologians.

What has been that one aspect of the faith or topic that you are now wrestling with? There must be something that sticks out to you throughout these weeks of ordinary time.

Know that your priests are praying for you while on pilgrimage for World Youth Day, and we look forward to celebrating the mysteries of Christ with you soon!



Brothers and sisters in Christ,

I am humbled and grateful to Rev. Terrence Coonan Jr. for allowing me the opportunity to celebrate Mass with you on August 5th and 6th and to share news of a project that is critical in my homeland of Nigeria. I am serving in the Congregation of The Holy Spirit, also known as the Spiritans. For over 300 years our missionaries have served the spiritual and physical needs of the poor all over the world. Holy Ghost Haven Foundation was founded to address the extreme and urgent need of the poor and less privileged, and to house and heal the sick and infirmed Spiritan missionaries that have served so many in their lives.

The small compound in Mgbidi, Nigeria is locally referred to as "Holy Ghost Haven" and includes a small hospital and rest home where the elderly and missionary priests can be treated. These facilities are in desperate need of repair and expansion. This is emotionally heart rending because these missionaries have totally dedicated their lives to the cause of God, love, and humanity and are dependent on the generosity of others to house them in their time of need.

I am writing today to emphasize our urgent need to expand the healthcare center and home for the retired Spiritan confreres in Mgbidi, Nigeria. Holy Ghost Haven also serves the needs of the poor in the rural area who have no other means for healthcare. I ask you to prayerfully consider helping us meet the needs of these missionaries.

The needs of our confreres at Mgbidi are increasing every day and a donation makes a critical impact on our mission to serve them. I ask for your prayers for our efforts and our missionaries.
