SAINTS FROM AROUND THE WORLD

The saints for our mural window are finally narrowed down. I'm sure many of you were excited about these potential results since the survey went out for feedback from parishioners. I thought of putting the list further down, but realized it would take heroic patience to actually read my explanation before glancing at the list, so here we go.

- 1. Elizabeth Ann Seton (Colonial Anglo-American)
- 2. Peter the Apostle (ancient Jewish race)
- 3. Bl. Solanus Casey (Irish-American)
- 4. Mother Teresa of Kolkata (Calcutta) (Kosovar Albanian)
- 5. Martin De Porres (half Spanish, ¼ African, ¼ Native American)
- 6. Jose Sanchez del Rio (Hispanic)
- 7. Louis & Zelie Martin (French)
- 8. Kateri Tekakwitha (Native American)
- 9. Josephine Bakhita (African)
- 10. Magdalena of Nagasaki (Japanese martyr)

I wanted first to talk about how these saints were chosen for our mural in church. There are a few different strategies that could have been employed. Let me consider some of the alternative methods that I did not decide to use. First, we could have gone with the most commonly used saints of the past or current eras in churches - the "classics" or "new classics," so to speak. Secondly, you could go purely by popular vote of the parish, likely producing a list that would look like the first, but perhaps having one or two divergences. Thirdly, you could select saints that fit the local place: either by parish, region, or ethnicity (for example, favorites for a Polish community or saints who lived in our area). Finally, you could focus on saints that are "patrons" of particular things that speak to your community or the current needs of our world. While all of these methods could also produce a good list of saints, I wanted to use a different strategy that focused on the meaning of the word "Catholic," that is, universal. The universal church is something that spans 2,000 years, all the continents, all ages, and all walks of life (all vocations). I thought it would be good to represent that well in our church building, which is very doable but also very difficult to achieve with just ten choices. (Ten is the number proposed and agreed upon with our artist given the space and the desire to have the saints in good visible size from the pews). So based on this strategy as well as the feedback from the survey, I have arrived at the list of saints you see above.

Let me expound a little bit on how these saints represent the word "Catholic." We have every continent represented (sorry Australia), and super diverse according to race. We have three younger saints, though it will be perhaps a bit harder to portray that Kateri and Magdalena were 24 and 22-23 at the time of death (martyrdom for Magdalena). We have religious and non-religious. Number 7 on the list is a two-for-one, so I'm glad to sneak in an eleventh saint up there. I also think it important to have a married couple to represent the holy mission of this vocation and to the importance of family life (with marriage as its source). Thus we have represented five men and six women.

As some of these saints are probably not very familiar to you, they also are not my own top ten list. I want to be clear that I am not choosing just who I want to be up here, but am basing it off these two guiding principles: "catholic" universality, and feedback from the survey. We are getting pretty creative with the Asian saint (Japanese martyr Magdalena) as we had other better-known options, but this was one of those recommended by the artist to provide someone who provides a very unique opportunity for outfit and appearance, lest we forget that Japan had a strong Catholic history especially in Nagasaki. This lesser-known saint is a reminder of how the Church is much bigger than we ourselves know. It is good to have our horizons expanded like this. We will probably have some kind of key to the mural in our church to help us learn about each of the saints and why their lives may be an inspiration to us. I hope this is something that continues to benefit our parish as we all find our own unique ways God is inviting us to fit into the universal ("catholic") call to be saints.






Bible Study


