

TAKE TIME FOR RELATIONSHIPS

It is important for us to set aside time for our relationships. A little bit of family-time each day should be a goal, even if not always looking the same from day to day: dinner together, night prayers, going to an event together. Spouses should try to have a chance each day to have some quiet time together, and perhaps a dedicated "date night" each month. We should try to visit our family if they are close, or connect over the telephone or write a letter. All of our human relationships need dedicated time and attention. The same is true for our relationship with the Lord. A week ago the Fraternus men and mentors set aside some time especially for the Lord with their Fall excursion, and next week the Fidelis ladies are doing the same. They have some fun over those two days, but also have a lot of time carved out for the most important relationship in our lives, including prayers such as the Rosary, periods of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, and opportunities for Confession, along with Holy Mass, fulfilling their Sunday obligation to do what is "right and just": worshiping God for who He is and for all He blesses us with.

Adults have similar opportunities here in our parish and elsewhere. Four weeks from now is the women's Welcome Retreat, starting on Saturday the 28th. Two weeks later, the men's Welcome Retreat will be held. I encourage retreats of some form for us all, because we need to make time for the relationships that matter to us, and the Lord should matter immensely to us. These retreats are great because they are held in our parish and organized by parishioners according to a trusted and fruitful format, but uniquely our own. If you can make yourself available those weekends (sacrificing other opportunities is something almost all of us have to do) then I encourage you to consider it. If you give God a weekend, you will reap dividends, I assure you – just not for your bank account!

Speaking of accounts, I want to thank you for your attention to the Annual Bishop's Appeal video last weekend, which I thought did a praiseworthy job of humble transparency for how the diocesan budget is allocated. This gives great assurance that our contributions to the appeal are important and impactful, bearing fruit in real ways through various ministries. Please discern with the Lord how He is directing you to support the appeal this year. Consider 1% of your annual income as a starting point of your discernment, and let God lead you from there. Generosity with God never goes unnoticed, even if the benefits are stored up for eternity. I think God usually gives spiritual rewards (fruits of the Holy Spirit and virtues) even in this life, but the gift should be given without such calculations and expectations. We give because we have received. We are stewards and are meant to use our goods in a way that would please God and be of benefit to others.

As you turn in your pledge cards (even if it is a one-time donation or you cannot contribute this year), our diocese is growing more closely united in this joint effort. May God help us to truly live as one body in Christ Jesus and build up His Kingdom one day at a time, one soul at a time.


A WALK TO REMEMBER




