THANKS BE TO GOD, FOR ALL OUR GIFTS

We welcome the gift of another parochial vicar in our parish, Fr. LeeAllen Fortin, who will begin his new assignment here at the end of the month. Fr. Fortin will have a special responsibility from Bishop Rhoades to care for the Catholic patients at Lutheran Hospital and in the nearby nursing homes. This pastoral care is something that Fr. Jake and I (as well as other priests in previous years) have tried to give our best, but was not always easy for us and sometimes made it hard to balance our time and ministry in the parish. I am glad that the hospital will have a priest presence consistently moving forward. Although his schedule will be very different, this parish looks forward to welcoming Fr. Fortin among us and to benefiting from his priestly ministry.

As schools resume for the winter season, we transition this week from the white of the Christmas Season (ending with Epiphany and the Baptism of the Lord) to the green of Ordinary Time. Our weeks before Ash Wednesday and the great preparatory season of Lent allow us a little time of reprieve from the hyperactivity of the busier periods of parish life. Still, we have a lot going on in our parish and school, and especially in our church.

Each week will likely mean "unpacking" more and more "gifts" with our renovations, likely all the way to Easter and perhaps beyond it. Soon the tile floor will be finished and we will begin "marbleizing" the pillars and arch to appear as realistic marble that will match our future altar, ambo, and altar of repose which is on its way from Italy (no estimate on arrival as of yet). It could be a month or so before this work is complete in our sanctuary. Meanwhile the other artists working on the large paintings (currently the crucifixion scene for under the arch) and the stained glass windows (second window is nearing end of production) are continuing their work with steady progress. Our sound system should be installed in a couple weeks or so, which will be better than our current situation that only covers the basics and is not ideal. Also, our pendant lights are being fabricated with estimated delivery a few weeks away, with installation to follow. All of this work should continue to be done Monday through Friday each week so that our weekend Masses in the Church can continue without much change.

If you are a married couple and are interested in investing in your marriage with a weekend retreat, please consider attending the Marriage Encounter retreat here at our parish. You will hear about this retreat experience at the end of Masses this weekend. I hope their testimonies encourage you to have confidence in how God can take your marriage from good to great.

May God bless you and yours as we continue our journey home to heaven by the light of the star of Bethlehem that leads us to Jesus.






