Back to Ordinary Time... So Back to Ordinary Life? Wrong.

With the Christmas season finished, we continue our journey to heaven. Every time we celebrate the high seasons of the Christian faith, there is something new stirring within us. We, like the shepherds and the wisemen, have encountered the Lord, the light of the world. His light changes how we see Him and how we see ourselves. You are not the same person you were before Advent just a month ago, and the Lord has something in store for you.

The Christian life is seemingly a life of struggle with sin and seems that its goal is to eradicate sin from our lives, but it is so much more. The charge to “repent and sin no more” is step one of the Christian life; and step two is being a disciple of Christ. We follow him, converse with Him, watch Him working and healing people, and we take part in it all.

As we continue to establish good habits and eradicate sin from our lives, we can better enjoy the goods of this world. After a day of fasting, food always has a greater flavor. After a day of hard work, sitting on the couch is more relaxing and refreshing. So too, our Christian life is one of discipline, eradicating vice through the practice of virtue, which then frees us to see the Kingdom present now and to enjoy its delights.

Ask the Lord to see what enslavement to vice or even just poor habits can be changed with His help. Do we need discipline with sleep, both reclining and rising at proper times? Even the small habit of the heroic minute (the refusal to press the snooze button and arise promptly) changes our ability to become masters of ourselves. Do we need discipline with food? What the secular world calls dieting, Christians see the spiritual benefit, offer the sacrifice to God, and call it fasting or abstinence. Do we have discipline with prayer? There are many supports (books, apps, podcasts, etc.) to help you to pray according to your disposition; however, nothing can replace silent time in adoration with the Lord.

Start with a small discipline, and it will change your relationship with Christ and with the world. We eradicate sin, so as to rejoice in the life Christ has bestowed on us. There’s no going back to former ways or former habits, only living a life in greater communion with God the Father, Son, and Spirit.
