# WHAT WOULD GOD DESIRE FOR YOU THIS LENT?

The season of Lent is almost here. Because Valentine's Day coincides with Ash Wednesday, please transfer any fancy dinners to other dates, as we (18–59yrs and in good health) are obliged to fast that day, with one normal meal and if necessary one or two small snacks that don't add up to a meal. The words that will soon be wrapping around our church interior will remind us every day of the year about our Christian vocation, and especially what we are meant to do while at Mass.

"I appeal to you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect."

In the words from verse two, we see a summary of the universal call to holiness: "be transformed by the renewal of your mind." Metanoia is the Greek word that we translate as repentance, and it a combination of the words for "mind" (nous) and "beyond" (meta). Going beyond your own mind is a call to transcendence or transformation of our way of thinking.

I am reading a new book (a long essay) that very intelligently lays out the basics of what our popular culture quietly believes in, as a sort of "Religion of the Day," which is also its title. I offer you one basic point from the book to think about:

What is the religion we need to be converted out of, if we are to be truly converted to Christ? (perfectly and totally, not somewhat and partially) The book quotes Alisdar MacIntyre's essay "Catholic instead of What?" which outlines the same point: "To be a reflective Catholic is always to be a Catholic rather than something else. So how is it with us here and now?" His point is what is the false teaching, the false religion, that we need to avoid in our times?

What is the thing we need to be converted from this Lent? Where does our mind need to be transformed from the false underlying principles of the secular culture's implicit religion? What things from this world are contrary to the Gospel and are leaking into my mindset, my lifestyle, my heart?

This is a good starting point for your reflection as you determine what God would desire for you this Lent. I suggest you take those questions and ask them to Jesus during your prayer this week. For example: Jesus, what do I need to be converted from? Jesus, how do you wish to transform my mind this Lent?

May God truly transform our minds as he transformed this church space. This is the path to being the saint that God desires for us, the saint we will be either on earth or in heaven. Blessed Lent to you all!

It is recommended that parents attend the class before the birth of your child so that there will be no delay in setting a date for the baptism once the baby is born.


The next baptismal prep class is scheduled February 4, 2024 or March 3, 2024 @12:45 pm in the Mother Teresa room.












## **QUEEN OF ANGELS HASA TRIVIA NIGHT**
