Fr. Terry's Letter



FROM MARY, WE LEARN SO MUCH

The Easter Vigil, which starts outside at twilight around a fire, focuses on the great paschal candle for the first 20 some minutes of the liturgy (lasting about three hours for our parish this year). This candle leads the procession into the church and represents our vigil of prayer for the evening, staying awake and recalling the salvation history that leads up to the person of Christ, foreshadowing the new life that we enjoy in baptism.

For all fifty days of Easter (Pentecost is the last day), we watch that candle burn in the sanctuary to remind us of Christ's victory. After Easter, it is moved to the baptismal font area, and we light the baptismal candles from this light. It is also brought forward to the front edge of the sanctuary for funerals.

Our paschal candle is once again custom-made from the work of Anastassia Cassady – whose original works fill a wonderful book on the saints by John and Catherine Cavadini (father & daughter), titled "Saints: A Family Story." With much thought and reflection, I ended up deciding to ask her to decorate our candle with the Sacred Heart and Immaculate Heart, along with a couple scripture passages: Lux in tenebris lucet (The Light shines in the darkness – John 1:5) and "By His wounds we are healed" (Isaiah 53:5)

We will start at the top. Mary's Immaculate Heart at the top of the candle, under the three golden bars, is wrapped in roses, which in medieval centuries reminded Christians of the Blessed Virgin – hence the song "Behold a rose e'er blooming," as well as the prayer of the "rosary." The heart of Mary is also pierced with a sword (or seven) because Simeon prophesied that a sword would pierce her heart at the Presentation. The flames represent her burning love, for God and for all her children (given to her by Christ from the Cross by His last recorded words to her). Pope St. John Paul II spoke of Our Lady at the Shrine in D.C., saying: "This woman of faith, Mary of Nazareth, the Mother of God, has been given to us as a model in our pilgrimage of faith. From Mary, we learn to surrender to God's will. From Mary, we learn to trust even when all hope seems gone. From Mary, we learn to love Christ, her Son and the Son of God. Mary is not only the Mother of God, but she is also the Mother of the Church as well." May our Heart be more and more like hers.

The Sacred Heart deserves its own article, as many have spent books writing about this great mystery. So that will be next time. Until then, God bless you on this Divine Mercy Sunday!


