THE HOLY FAMILY

The Holy Family is a special opportunity to remember the fundamental cell of human society. We are created to be in relationship, and the most fundamental relationship, built into our very existence, is child to parent. That basic relationship is the natural foundation of the family, the primary institution that God created. The Lord uses the family to help us understand our relationship to Him: in Jesus Christ, the Father adopts us as His own daughters and sons! Because God desires us to grow in our familial relationship with Him, He gave us the family, which even despite the imperfection of its members, is our first school in the "communion of persons" that we were made for: LOVE. Members of families are meant to communicate with one another, to be open, to trust, to share, to give. In this regard, it is very important to eat meals together and to know when to switch off the television!

In his encyclical on the family, Pope St. John Paul II says that the family must "become what it is." This is quite a paradox at first sight - how can something become what it is? What the Pope is saying is that the family must develop its full potential according to God's plan, for its own inner life as a community of persons based on marriage, for its service of life, for its wider role in society and for its life of faith within the Church (cf. Familiaris

Consortio 17). For example: the family is the "domestic church," (the community of believers); it is the sanctuary of life; it is the first living cell of society; it is meant to develop and build up the world around it – neighborhood, city, state, country; it is the school of love and faith. What a gift the family is.

We know also, that so many of us have family situations that are clouded with difficulty: tragedies of various forms, mental or physical health problems, strained relationships, addiction, financial problems, or separation.

These deep pains for many families across the globe underscores the importance of family life even more, and also can manifest the great help and support that family can provide for us (including extended family and our family of faith, the church).

New Years' Day, the 8th day of Christmas, is always given to the honor of the Mother of God. If the rosary is not a daily practice of yours, days dedicated to our Lady such as this would the perfect time to give it a try. Either way, we hope to see you and yours at Mass for this obligatory solemnity, either for the Vigil Masses or on the actual holiday ("holy day"). A Blessed New Year to you and your families. Let us open ourselves to the grace of God this year and one day join the Communion of Saints in heaven!





Listen Everywhere Hearing Assistance system

For our parishioners that used our Hearing Loop system, our parish has replaced that system with the Listen Everywhere system in our sanctuary. The Loop system required listeners to sit in a designated area in the sanctuary. The Listen Everywhere system will allow you to sit anywhere in the sanctuary, gathering area or even the parish hall and hear mass.

To use the Listen Everywhere system, you have 2 options. You can either download and install the Listen Everywhere on your personal device or pick up a Listen Everywhere dedicated handheld device at the welcome center.

For parishioners that would like to install the Listen Everywhere app on their personal device, you will need to connect to the Listen Everywhere Wi-Fi, see the Wi-Fi password below. After the app is installed and open, the Listen Everywhere app will search for the server automatically. Once it queries and finds the system, choose the Sanctuary channel to listen to mass. You are all set.

If you need to use the dedicated Listen Everywhere devices at the Welcome center, you will either need to connect your device either by Bluetooth or cable. Someone at the Welcome center can assist in getting you connected to the dedicated Listen Everywhere handheld device.


New Year Resolutions?!?
