Stations of the Cross

As some of you already know, our parish has plans to place 14 life-size Stations of the Cross alongside our pathway parallel to Aboite Center Rd. As a part of the approval process, we have been talking with diocesan offices and the planning and zoning commission of the City of Fort Wayne. It was in the recent proposal before the commission committee that Wane 15 ran a story of the anticipated Stations in Southwest Fort Wayne. Pending approval, the stations will be spaced beginning near the stoplight at the entrance to Westlakes and Indian Trails Park and will end near our Aboite Center entrance.

As we are undertaking this project, I wanted to give you more insight into how this all came about. The Mastrangelo family in honor of their parents Dr Mike & Grace gave a donation to this parish to be used as an outward manifestation of our faith. This family believes that our Catholic tradition is best preserved by both faith and works. This same family was inspired to begin the ministry and service of Matthew 25 in downtown Fort Wayne. Thus, they had hoped for a project that would be used on our grounds to both beautify our campus and bring the light of Christ to those who should pass by. After months of discernment, we were inspired with the thought of these Stations of the Cross. It is my prayer that people will be moved by Jesus' Paschal Mystery - his suffering, death, resurrection and ascension. Jesus spoke multiple times of his passion and crucifixion that he may reconcile all of us to God. In seeing Jesus' suffering through the stations, we shall know and remember the length God's loves goes and be drawn into the Church so as to be near his presence among us in the Eucharist.

As this parish has undertaken many projects for the manifestation of the Faith, I would hope to also inspire a greater undertaking of good works. Although our emphasis right now is on the manifestations of the Faith (renovations and this project), we do not neglect one for the other. We have given part of our income to various ministries in the community in order to help the poor, and we have set aside part of our budget to help various projects that you may undertake to help those in need. Our Grant Ministry has been, sadly, underutilized for our parish but that may be because not many know about it. There are forms on our website to submit to the grant committee in order for this parish to support the good work you wish to undertake, especially when cost becomes a barrier for the good work to proceed. Hopefully the word of this grant ministry may now be more well known among our parishioners; if you have any questions please contact the parish office. When the Lord inspires you to undertake a particular apostolate, we would like to help in any way we can.

May the Lord bless your good work and bring it to completion according to His plan.

BAPTISMAL PREP CLASS




