

LOOKING AHEAD

While you are probably aware of the great gift of an outdoor stations of the Cross that is in the works for our campus, I want to update you on the bigger project that has steadily been developing for our church. We indeed continue to work on Phase II designs for our church renovations, and I have discussed the progress multiple times, both with the parish council and the finance council and staff. We have benefited from parishioner feedback as well, especially from your responses to the survey and your presence and comments at the presentation I gave a few months ago.

Things are progressing well, and we are nearing the end of design ideas, but still have some things to consider. Currently it looks like we would have the following elements: a choir loft with organ reinstalled; a large meeting room above the gathering space; reconfigured bathrooms to provide a better experience; a larger vestibule at the main entrance with a lot of natural perhaps by May or June. If light; a rose window and

statue above the main entrance, with a tower above that (hopefully with potential for bells in the future). Alongside this project, we also plan to replace our pews affected as little as possible. with new ones, in part thanks to the generous offer of some anonymous parishioners to help cover a large portion of their cost. We are confident that these will not only complete the vision that Phase I had begun to help us to worship better in church, but also to help our church witness to the local community about who we are. We have helped our church to emphasize beauty and the sacred on the inside, and now we are hoping to do the same on the outside.

While we are still in the design process, our cost estimates for Phase II are not complete. However, we are certain that these costs will demand a capital campaign of some sort. It is still too early to know precisely when that will begin, but I am informing you of all of this now because I hope that it will be within this year, so, construction could begin

before the Winter or perhaps even before the Fall. The first goal for a construction schedule will be to have Christmas and Easter

We are confident that this would not require Masses to be held outside of church. We need not fear having Masses in the gymnasium again - which is certainly a big relief to your priests: that was stressful work! The greatest challenge would be how the gathering space would be affected during those months of construction. While we will try to mitigate the consequences, it will be a construction site, so safety needs to be a high priority, even when it means sacrificing.

We have a series of approvals to obtain from diocesan teams (finance, buildings & grounds, and liturgy), and we will take things one step at a time. Please keep it in your prayers.






