

How to prepare for Lent

I would like to share with you some ideas about preparing for Lent. We have six and a half weeks of Lent as a preparation for Easter. This preparation typically focuses on three practices in the spiritual life, which are described by Christ in the Gospel for Ash Wednesday: prayer, fasting (sacrifice), almsgiving (service). We all typically choose something for ourselves in those areas. But I want you to really ask God what He wants you to do, and not just pick something that suits yourself. While Lent isn't necessarily "better" just because it is "harder," there might be some real obstacles that the Lord wants us to overcome. So let's take it to prayer, so that it is not "my Lent, for me" but rather "His Lent, for me."

Remember that we don't aim to "impress God" with how awesome our Lent is. God is not impressed, although he may be honored. But we don't need to earn God's love.

People commonly "fail" in Lent – meaning that they don't keep their resolutions perfectly. At some point, you slip up. That's actually not a sin, and not even an obstacle to a "good"

Lent, because it can help you achieve the greatest goal of Lent: knowing more deeply and sincerely that you need God to save you, that you aren't going to save yourself. This lesson in humility, Admitting that we are not as strong as we think we are, is more important than anything else Lent can do for you. Remember: we don't need to earn God's love – it is a free gift from the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. And when you fail in a resolution that is small and simple, it is even better for teaching you humility!

With that being said, I would suggest a sort of "sliding scale" of Lent as you bring it to God in prayer.

- 1. If you don't do much on a daily and weekly basis for your faith, aim bigger. Look for goals that will really "stretch" your faith life.
- 2. If you already do quite a bit, aim smaller. Focus on intentionality and not losing the heart of what you are doing.

May God bless us all with open hearts to let Him show us the Lent He desires for us! St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, pray for us!


St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Traveling Statue






