Easter Triduum Schedule







Holy Thursday: 7 pm*

At this supper on the night He was betrayed, the Lord Jesus, loving those who were His own in the world even to the end, offered His body and blood to the Father under the appearances of bread and wine, gave them to the apostles to eat and drink, then enjoined the apostles and their successors in the priesthood to offer them in turn. This Mass is, first of all, the memorial of the institution of the Eucharist, that is the memorial of the Lord's Passover, by which under sacramental signs He perpetuated among us the sacrifice of the New Law. It also commemorates the institution of the the priesthood. Adoration of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament will be available following Mass in the parish hall until 11 pm.

Good Friday: 3 pm*

A day of fasting, abstinence, and prayer because on this day, when "Christ our paschal lamb was sacrificed" (1 Cor 5:7), what had long been promised in signs and figures was at last revealed and brought to fulfillment. The true lamb replaced the symbolic lamb, and the many offerings of the past gave way to the single sacrifice of Christ.

Easter Vigil: 9 pm

It is the greatest and most noble of all solemnities, the mother of all Vigils. On this holy night, the Church keeps watch, celebrating the resurrection of Christ in the sacraments and awaiting His return in glory. It is the turning point of the Triduum, the Passover of the new covenant, which marks Christ's passage from death to life. Holy Church meditates on the wonders that God has done for His people from the beginning and welcomes new members into His family.

Easter Sunday: 8 am, 10 am & 12 pm

The celebration of the risen Lord continues from the Easter Vigil. Alleluia He has risen!

Morning Prayer will be prayed in the main church at 8:15 am* on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday.

FR. TERRY'S COLUMN



"They will look upon Him whom they have pierced." - Zechariah 12:10

Last week began Passiontide and the veiling of statues and other images in church except the Stations of the Cross. The readings at Mass last week increased the intensity of conflict between Jesus and the Jewish leadership groups (Scribes, Saducees, Pharisees, and above all the Sanhedrin). One of the readings from the Old Testament was the story from Numbers where the Hebrews complained in the desert to Moses and were punished by seraph serpents ("burning") whose poison hurt, and even killed some. At God's command, Moses makes a bronze serpent that is raised up on a pole to be a source of healing.

The Gospel for that same day was from John, where Jesus alludes to the same story: "When you lift up the Son of Man, then you will realize that I AM." John 8:28

With these palm branches in our hands, we lift up the Son of Man not just onto a donkey to enter the Holy City, but we also hear the long telling of how our sins have hoisted Our Lord to the Cross.

We look upon the poison of our sin, and it stings to do so, because we realize that we are not only telling the most important story of our faith from two millennia earlier. We are also telling the story that is yours and mine: we are playing a part in this great drama. This is our story.

And despite the pain it brings us to do so, we find healing here, when we look upon the One that our sins have pierced. We see not only the disgusting effects of sin, but we see the greatest sign of God's infinite love for fallen humanity. We discover the depths that God will go to, the pains He will endure, so that we can be free of this unbearable burden of sin and its wages which is death - in the fullest and most horrible sense, greater than physical death - what St. Francis calls "the second death."

"By His wounds, we are healed" we will hear on Good Friday before we read the passion from John's Gospel. The antidote for our sin is to look at its horror, to bring it to God's mercy in the confessional, and to turn away from it once and for all. Let us take our blessed palm branches home as a reminder of our part in this story, of what we have seen here today, and resolve to live in the new life that Christ brings us next Sunday.






