FR. TERRY'S COLUMN

"The Faith is not a survival... It has not survived; it has returned again and again in this western world of rapid change and institutions perpetually perishing."

- G.K. Chesterton, The Everlasting Man

These words here are important. The author refers to the fact of Jesus truly dying and truly returning to life. Think for a moment about that last phrase, "institutions perpetually perishing," and relate it to the last 2000 years of history. Consider even a few of those institutions: how they came to be, how they thrived or at least survived, and how they eventually fell into the mist of memory.

Now consider the Bride of Christ, the Church, and all those who have faith in the Resurrection. The faith of the believers can't be quelled in its entirety because the Church is not a man-made institution. While it is full of bumbling humans who make mistakes and sin a lot, it is also grounded solidly on the faith of the Cross and the hope for Heaven. This is the same reason St. Paul tells us not to be conformed to this world, as is written in the blue banner of our Church. Even back then, He understood the frenzied, revolving patterns in society. He knew that the world would never stand still, but its members can stand firm in the Lord.

While we might be a part of a world that will eventually pass away, we can be confident in faith. Cling close to Jesus, so as not to be caught up in those things that perish. Instead, follow in faith the one who gives us eternal life. And join in the company of the saints, so beautifully depicted now in our sanctuary's "heavenly realms," who have died to this world and have returned to life in the Resurrection of Jesus, the King of Kings and conqueror of death and sin. Happy Easter!



The next baptismal prep class is scheduled May 4, @ 12:45 pm in the Mother Teresa room.



ANNUAL BULLETIN ANNOUNCEMENT

It remains important for our Church to protect children and young persons from the evils of abuse. The Diocese of Fort Wayne-South Bend remains committed to upholding and following its guidelines, policies and procedures that were implemented for the protections of children and young people. These can be reviewed on the diocese's website, www.diocesefwsb.org. under "Youth Protection." If you have reason to believe that a minor may be a victim of child abuse or neglect, Indiana law requires that you report this to civil authorities. If you or someone you know was abused as a child or young person by an adult, you are encouraged to notify appropriate civil authorities of that abuse. In addition, if the alleged abuser is or was a priest or deacon of the Catholic Church, you are encouraged to contact Jodi Marlin, Victim Assistance Coordinator, at (260) 399-1447 or jmarlin@diocesefwsb.org; or Rev. Mark Gurtner, Vicar General of the Diocese of fort Wayne-South Bend, at P.O. Box 390, Fort Wayne, Indiana, 46801; at (260) 399-1447; or at mgurtner@diocesefwsb.org. the diocese is committed to helping prevent the abuse or neglect of children and young people and to assist those who have suffered harm as a result of such abuse.

SEAS St Vincent de Paul Conference presents it's *Grow It Forward* fundraiser. You will be able to purchase 4" potted Big Boy Tomato, Sweet 100 Cherry Tomato, green bell pepper, or jalapeño pepper plants, or seed packets of squash, beans, and greens. Purchase for your garden or sponsor for a neighbor being assisted through our St Elizabeth Food Pantry to grow their own.

The 4" vegetable plants (\$5) and seed packets (\$2) will be available to purchase or sponsor the *Grow It Forward* weekend of May 17th & May 18th after all Masses. We will accept cash, check or credit/debit card. (Cards will incur a 3% processing fee). This will also be an opportunity to sponsor (purchase a plant for someone needing assistance to grow their own veggies) or to make a charitable donation to our *Grow It Foward* fundraiser.

You will be able to purchase/seeds that Monday evening—5 days early of Grow It Forward weekend.
