

GOOD THINGS HAPPENING, THANKS BE TO GOD

This weekend will be the last set of our First Communion Masses. The children that have prepared over the past year for this special moment are certainly a blessing to all of us, as we get to experience through fresh eyes the greatest treasure that we have on earth. This treasure of ours is the truest and deepest fulfillment of the words Moses spoke to the Lord's people in Deuteronomy 4:7 "For what great nation is there that has a god so near to it as the LORD our God is to us, whenever we call upon him?" Surely even the great prophet of the Lord could not have imagined how his words could take up a meaning so much deeper and truer than when first spoken. For how much closer can God get than entering our bodies and souls in Holy Communion? Let us continue to rejoice in this gift, along with our First Communicants, throughout the Easter season and of course all year round!

Thanks to the efforts of the Adoration expansion team, our parish continues relishing in this gift in a particular way through Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament. Since Easter we have begun more hours of adoring Jesus, exposed in the Monstrance. Now we are starting at 6am on both Tuesday and Wednesday in the chapel. Much of Tuesday will continue in church as before, but all of Wednesday it will remain in the chapel until 8pm. I encourage you to stop by for a visit if you haven't tried yet. Whether five minutes or an hour, it will be time well spent.

This week I will be gone for a weeklong workshop for training on the new process for ordaining priests, and especially for mentoring them through transition to ministry. After this week I will be halfway through the program and will feel confident in our parish's ability to lead priests even better. Pray for Fr. Jake and Fr. Fortin while I am away, and see you on the weekend!




