FR. TERRY'S COLUMN

A lot is happening in our lives. This time is always a little fretful, with unexpected things coming up, some good and some not, but all attempting to create a sense of urgency and perhaps even panic within us. A lot is happening in the parish too. But I'm not going to talk about that. You can see it in the rest of the bulletin as we do every week. Today I want to help you slow down.

The fourth candle of the Advent wreath is lit. We are in the final days of preparation for the great celebration of Christmas. Do not rush ahead of these days. Let the anticipation be an opportunity for us to experience the years and even centuries of longing that was felt in the hearts of the Lord's faithful people. The Jewish people kept the law season after season, generation after generation, and hoped for the fulfillment of Moses' words that the Lord would send a prophet like himself to deliver them - the "Anointed One," the Messiah.

Our Lord spoke of them to His disciples in the following words: "Blessed are the eyes that see what you see! For I tell you that many prophets and kings desired to see what you see, and did not see it, and to hear what you hear, and did not hear it." (Luke 10:23-24) Prophets and kings died before this day of the Anointed One, an era that we so easily take for granted because it was fulfilled long before our own stories began.

Perhaps we can get a better glimpse of what their longing was like by tapping into our own deeper hopes and desires. What are the greatest griefs of your heart? What fears do you wish were taken away forever? What dreams do you have for a world that is weary with sin? Can you imagine a peace that is enduring and true? A world without poverty, without sickness, without broken relationships. "The Lord will destroy death forever." (Isaiah) What a gift it will be. One day that dream will come true, under the reign of Christ the King. As we await His second coming with joyful hope and longing, we can understand more closely the hope of the Old Testament. Then Christmas finds its true center: in the small child wrapped in swaddling clothes and held in Mary's arms - the Messiah who is the beginning of our dreams come true.

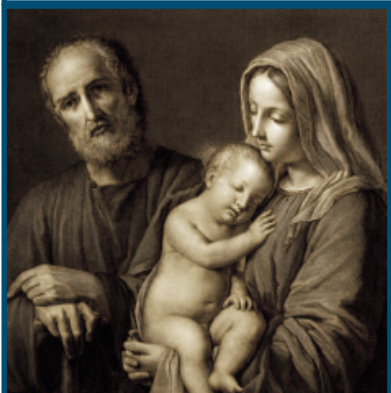

Consecration to the Holy Family



How to prepare

In preparation for a Consecration to the Holy Family, your family should not only decide to dedicate itself to the Holy Family's intercession but also acknowledge that the family is sacred. The decision to consecrate your family needs to be intentional and a process through which you completely surrender to God through the Holy Family. You are accepting the truth that salvation history was changed forever by a family, and that through your domestic church, you are called to live their example.

Four suggested steps before praying the Consecration to the Holy Family:

1. Discuss the importance of this consecration as a family and why you are doing it.
2. Each member of your family is strongly encouraged to go to the sacrament of reconciliation.
3. As a family, intentionally choose something to fast from. The fast can be for at least a week. Fasting helps to discipline our minds and hearts to refrain from secular activities and be more focused on God.
4. Prepare for the commitment you are making. Consecration to the Holy Family is not a single
